

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF
EVA, ALABAMA, HELD ON FEBRUARY 13, 1964.

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Eva, Alabama, held their regular meeting on February 13, 1964, at the school in the Town of Eva, Alabama, at 7:00 P.M.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and ask the Town Clerk to call the roll. All members of the Town's governing body, consisting of the Mayor and five Councilmen, were present for this meeting. The Mayor ask the Town Clerk to read the minutes of the previous meeting. After the reading of the minutes, the Mayor ask if there were any corrections to be made in the minutes. There were no corrections to be made so the Mayor declared the minutes approved as read.

The Mayor then ask for reports from any committees. There were no committees to give any reports.

The Mayor next ask for other information that should be brought before the Council relating to resolutions, ordinances, orders, and other business. There were no ordinances presented for consideration at this meeting. The Town Clerk presented to the Council four bills for consideration. One for \$5.00 owed to Eva High School for ledger back, paper, and receipt book; one for \$47.50 owed to Decatur Printing Co. for printing Privilege License Code; one for \$4.30 owed to Office Equipment Co. for ordinance book binder; and another one for \$39.49 owed to Judge T. C. Almon for fees for the incorporation of the Town of Eva. A motion was made by Councilman McDonald instructing Town Clerk to pay the four bills that are mentioned above. This motion was seconded by Councilman Patton. All members of the Council voted in favor of this motion. Another motion was made by Councilman McDonald instructing Town Clerk to have 500 letterhead envelopes and stationery printed and also purchase a book binder and paper for the minutes of the meetings

of the Town Council. This motion was seconded by Councilman Livingston. All members of the Council voted in favor of this motion. The Council then spent a few minutes discussing the Privilege License Code and who should be required to purchase a license to operate in the Town of Eva.

The Mayor mentioned the fact that it might be possible for the Town of Eva to get a "Low-Rent" housing project similar to some that other Towns were getting. No further action was taken on this matter.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the same was, on motion, duly ajourned.
