

Minutes of the meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Town of Eva held in regular session at 7 p.m. on July 12, 1979, attended by the Mayor and the following members of the Council: Jerry Mobley, Terrell Livingston, Alton Page and Ray Morgan.

Minutes of the June 14 meeting were read and approved. A financial report giving end of June totals was presented as follows:

The report was accepted without comment.

The Mayor stated that he and Charles Nichols would go to see Howard Proctor at the Civil Defense Office to see what he may be able to do about getting us a siren from the Anniston Ordnance Depot. Mr. Page stated that he had checked with the MP Office at Redstone Arsenal and they do not have any surplus lights or sirens on the arsenal; that all such surplus items are at Anniston.

The Mayor quoted from the June report of Carol Newman about the survey going on at Ryan, showing that a total of 90 people had been surveyed. Of these, 52 are over age 70; 39 are male and 51 are female; 14 live alone. There was one handicapped person counseled, and a need for a homemaker was reported to the County. Several of these people are attending the Eva Nutrition Site until one can be started at Ryan.

The Mayor briefly discussed the mail that had come into the office during June. He pointed out the following items in the Memo from the Secretary of State concerning changes in Alabama's Election Laws: (1) Election officials would be paid a minimum of \$25 per day. (2) Polling places will open by 8 a.m. and close no earlier than 6 p.m.

The package from the Citizens TORT Reform Commission was briefly discussed, as was the report from the North Central Alabama Mental Health Center stating that inpatient services have been curtailed because of lack of funds. The contracted psychiatric service costs the Center \$121 per day for each person.

Since the Mayor plans to be out of town Monday through Wednesday, and since we expect some laborers to report to work Monday, Mr. Mobley and Mr. Livingston will be at Town Hall at 8 a.m. Monday to get the workers started.

Mrs. Holmes stated that the Morgan County Coordinator for the Elderly had said that she would hire Peggy Moses as the new Site Manager for the Eva Site, effective Monday July 16. The Council agreed that this was a good selection.

Bills presented for payment were: Water Bill of \$5.72; Office supplies \$1.99; Clerk's Salary for June \$100.30; Phone Bill \$44.99 less \$8.75 paid by Senior Citizens. Mr. Morgan offered the motion that said bills be paid; seconded by Mr. Page. Motion carried.

The Mayor stated that the Volunteer Fire Dept. would pay the \$15 registration fee for any of the 4 EMT's who wanted to attend the EMS Seminar on August 23. The clerk will inform the EMT's of the Seminar schedule and find out who would like to attend.

The Mayor stated that Mr. Childers had asked whether we could increase our rent payment to him on the Saddle Club Building used for the Senior Citizens Center. Mr. Livingston was asked to check with Mr. Childers to find out what he considers a reasonable increase.

The health screening at Eva Nutrition Site will be held August 8, and the nurse had asked for a quiet location, as private as possible, for this. Mr. Mobley will check about using a section of the Happy Day Kindergarten.

The Mayor asked the Clerk to write to Joe Wheeler about two security lights that are out.

There being no further business, Mr. Page offered the motion that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Mr. Mobley.
