THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF EVA,
ALABAMA, July 8, 1971.

The regular meeting of the mayor and council of the town of Eva, Alabama, met in their new City Hall building at 8:00 p.m. on the 8th day of July, 1971. Mayor Ryan asked for the reading of the minutes of the last communication. The minutes were read and approved.

There was no unfinished business.

Mayor Ryan asked for any departmental reports.

Several of the concerned citizens met with the council and expressed a desire for imposing a curfew within the city limits. Several personally expressed an emphatic desire for the proposed curfew. Councilman John Smith made a motion that the city impose a 10:00 p.m. curfew, provided it meets with County and State laws. The motion was seconded by councilman Claude Patton. A vote was had and all councilmen present voted in favor.

Bills of \$212.00 for paint and labor for painting the City Hall building and \$19.49 to Miner and Turner Super Saver for Miscellaneous items used on the City Hall building were presented for approval of payment. Councilman Patton made a motion and received a second by councilman Hipps that the bills be allowed paid. The motion carried unanimously.

After a general discussion on the purchase of a table for the City Hall, councilman Smith made a motion and a second was made by councilman Livingston that the higher of the two bids be accepted. The bids were made by Central Cabinet Shop of \$135.00 and Buettner Brothers Lumber Company of \$150.00.

A motion was made by councilman Livingston that the City purchase a filing cabinet for the City records. After a second by councilman Hipps, the motion carried to spend up to \$35.00 for said purchase.
