

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF EVA, ALABAMA, HELD ON MAY 12, 1966.

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Eva, Alabama held their regular meeting on May 12, 1966, at the school in the Town of Eva, Alabama, at 7:00 P.M.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and ask the Town Clerk to call the roll. All members of the Town's governing body, consisting of the Mayor and five Councilman, were present for this meeting. The Mayor ask the Town Clerk to read the minutes of the previous meeting. After the reading of the minutes, the Mayor ask if there were any corrections ~~to~~ be made in the minutes. There were no corrections to be made so the Mayor declared the minutes approved as read.

The Mayor then ask for reports from any committees. The committees had no reports.

The Mayor then ask for other information that should be brought before the Council relating to resolutions, ordinances, orders, and other business. There were no ordinances presented for consideration at this meeting.

Councilman Patton reported on the meeting with the Cullman City Council about the possibility of getting water from them. They seemed very much in favor of the idea but could not promise us anything definite until they talked with a consultant with the Federal Government from Atlanta with whom they were getting their loan to expand their water system. They also assured us that if the Federal Government said it was okay for us to get water, ^{They would be in favor} that the construction of their dam and filtering plant would not be completed until the end of 1966.

Councilman Hipps made a motion that a letter be written to Temple & Son Electric Co. of Gadsden inquiring about when a service truck would be coming through Eva and an estimate on the cost of repairing the Flashing light at the stop signs. Councilman Patton second the motion. All members voted in favor.

The clerk was asked to make a report on the financial standing of the Town and have the records available to the council.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the same was, on motion duly ajourned.
