

Minutes of Meeting of Eva Town Council held in regular session on April 12, 1984, attended by Mayor Ryan, and Councilmen Hipps, Livingston and Nichols. Minutes of the regular meeting held March 8 and the call meeting held March 14 were read and approved. Financial report was presented by the clerk as follows:

Old Business:

- 1-Mayor reported that Ezra Drinkard was coming right along with the repairs to the metal building, and that the Council needs to decide soon what is to be done with it. Motion was offered by Mr. Nichols, seconded by Mr. Hipps to authorize clerk to go ahead with payment to Mr. Drinkard as soon as he completes the work on the building, so that he will not have to wait until the next council meeting. Motion carried.
- 2-Mayor passed around the plans for review by council members of the architect's plans for inside the building as proposed by Mr. Sears at Wheeler Basin, for the Eva Library. The plans were then given to Mr. Livingston to take home for his wife, an experienced librarian, to review and comment on.
- 3-Jerry Mobley called the Mayor a week or so ago saying that he was in Decatur having the deeds made for the Childers property transfer.
- 4-Mayor read the letter from Mr. Jones on priority requests for 1984-85 at Eva School. The list drawn up by Principal Jones and the school trustees is the following:
 - a. Walk covers from Elementary School to Lunchroom, and from Jr. Hi Building to Gym and Bandroom. Aprx. \$6,000.00
 - b. Tractor; Ford Diesel 1510; 22 HP Aprx. \$6,000.00
 - c. Apple Computers @ Aprx. \$2,800.00
- 5-Mayor said that Tom Drake has gotten several thousand dollars worth of computers and word processors for Vinemont School and has some funds set aside for Falkville and Brewer-- around \$75,000 total. Mayor will try to contact Tom Drake to see if he can get some computers for Eva which is a feeder school to Brewer. He will try to find out before next council mtg.
- 6-Mayor has talked with Steve Cooley about getting Town of Eva some help from the State for development of the Childers property, for the Library, etc.. He said he would be out here in a few days, but hasn't come yet. Mayor will try again to reach him about this.
- 7-Cemetery deeds are being prepared.
- 8-Mayor said that we could go ahead and send a letter to Central Bank, asking about their interest in establishing a branch bank at Eva. Letter should be to the attention of Mr. Billy Hunter. Clerk has learned also the name of First Alabama's new president and will write to him also. This will complete the seven letters to Morgan County banks.
- 9-Mayor reported that the man who is working on our \$40,000 bank loan to buy the Childers place has been out sick for two weeks, and there's nothing new to report on this.
- 10-Mayor said the new fire truck should be ready soon. Mr. Nichols offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Hipps to pay the expenses of two people to go to Indiana to pick up the truck. Motion carried.

New Business:

- 1-Clerk reported from VFD Fire Chief that two trucks need repair; one has a bad fuel pump and the starter, on the other one is bad. Council authorized repairs to be made as needed.
- 2-Mayor asked Council Members to spread the word to the people that they are due a refund, or a reduction in their home fire insurance premiums because of the new ISO rating, which goes into effect on May 1. Clerk will prepare letter to ISO asking if they are notifying them ./.

insurance companies direct, or if we have to do that, we get the large sign at the intersection repainted to say that the Clinic is open Monday-Tuesday-Wednesday-Thursday and Friday. The Nurse at the clinic said that many people still do not know that the clinic is also open on Wed. now. Mayor said that he has some signs to be picked up at Hartselle and he will take this one down at the time to have it re-painted.

4-Mr. Nichols passed on an invitation from the Senior Citizens Center to the Barbecue to be held at the Site on May 18 at 2 p.m. Mayor asked the clerk to remind him about this.

5-Mr. Livingston offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Hipps to transfer funds as required, and to pay the bills as presented, which were:

From General Fund-Kindergarten teacher salary \$1,141.59; Ezra Drinkard for roof repairs at Health Clinic \$24.02; Petrolane Gas for Senior Citizens Center \$277.20; Water bills for Senior Center and Town Hall @ \$8.06 \$16.12; Electric Bills for Senior Center \$59.12; Town Hall \$48.06; Net phone bill \$46.46; Clerk's salary for March \$127.37; Roll of stamps \$20; Agnes Weeks for cleaning \$7.30. From Fire Dept. account-6 mos. premium on 1964 White truck \$60.40; annual premium on building and contents \$216; CAL Gas \$165; Eva 4-way for gas for truck 126 \$11.60. From Gasoline Tax Fund-Street lights \$129.89

There being no further business, Mr. Nichols offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Livingston that the meeting be adjourned.
