

Minutes of the regular meeting of the Eva Town Council held on April 13, 2010, 6:30 p.m. at the Eva Town Hall. Present: Mayor Gary Livingston, Councilmember's: Johnny Persall, James Henderson, Bert Collins, Brandlee Shadden and Clerk Judy Fortenberry. Mr. Chambers's absence due to work commitment.

Guests: Joe Hill, John Holmes, Betty and Kenneth Golden and Brian Brown

Mayor Livingston called the meeting to order; all council members present except for Mr. Chambers. After roll call, informed all present that we open our meetings with prayer, if anyone objected we would abstain from this practice at tonight's meeting. No one objected. Mayor Livingston asked Mr. Henderson to open with prayer.

Mayor dispensed with reading of the minutes until hearing from our guest. Mayor Livingston turned the meeting over to Brian Brown with the RC&D Office.

Mr. Brown announced the Urban Storm Water Meeting to be held at the Eva Recreation Park on May 6, 2010, at 10:00 a.m., he asked for a mailing list of other City's and Town's within our area, RC&D will mail out a letter inviting them to the event. Also, asked the town to pay the Cattlemen's Association \$1,000 for lunch on this date, stated that ALFA may pay for some of the food.

Mr. Brown also asked if we could put up a sign and ask that no one drive on the grass. Town will get with Activities Board and ask them not to drive on the grass.

Mayor also stated that we need another load of dirt for the infield.

Mr. Brown stated that the Alabama Clean Water Partnership will meet at 8:30 p.m. on this date at the Center, then another meeting after lunch.

Clerk will get with Ms. Livingston about the Community Center on that date, seniors can use the Town Hall Conference Room, and the town will provide their meal on this date.

Mayor Livingston asked if everyone had read the minutes of the March 9, 2010 regular Council Meeting. Council member Collins motion to approve the minutes, Council member Persall seconded, carried.

A: FINANCE, EDUCATION & LIBRARY- MR. CHAMBERS

Mayor Livingston reported that revenue income is down, but hopefully it will not stay down. He also reported that he had talked with Superintendent of Education Balch about the sewer problem at the school.

Ms. Golden reported that the computer classes at the Library are going over great; we have enough for two more classes if funds are available.

B: UTILITIES & STREETS- MR. SHADDEN

Mr. Shadden reported the road at the four-way is breaking up again; he has talked with the County about this problem. He also reported that the County is working on Stacy Road.

C: PARKS, RECREATION & CEMETERIES – MR. PERSALL

Mr. Persall reported the ball fields are looking good, and we do need sand where it is low.

D: POLICE, FIRE & GRANTS – MR HENDERSON

Mr. Henderson reported on the sidewalk contract – meet with contractor and engineering firm for a punch list. He stated that we have a fire hydrant in front of the Church of Christ that needs to be extended up now that construction is over.

Clerk reported that Chief Holmes had requested a large fire hydrant at the corner of Holmes and Sanders, we now have four large chicken houses, and two additional houses going in at this location.

Mr. Henderson reminded all that next week is spring clean-up for Morgan County; junk can be taken to the County Barn.

F: SANITATION & BUILDINGS –MR. COLLINS

Mr. Collins reported work on the sewer phase II is coming along, are having trouble boring under the road at a couple of locations.

Mr. Collins submitted two quotes for painting the Medical Building,

Kenneth Golden \$3,800 for both sides.

Mark Slaten \$5,100 for both sides.

Mr. Collins motion to accept the quote from Kenneth Golden, Mr. Persall seconded, carried.
