

Minutes of Meeting of Eva Town Council held in regular session December 9, 1982, at 7; attended by the Mayor and Councilmen Mobley, Livingston and Nichols. Volunteer Fire Captains Joe Hill and Benny Childers joined the meeting later.

Minutes of the November 11 regular meeting and the December 2 call meeting were read and approved. Financial report was accepted as presented, giving the following end-of-November balances:

Old Business:

1. Nothing new on the Deputy.
- 2-The gas company changed out the orifice and hooked up the heater in the Volunteer Fire Dept. They also swapped out the tank.
- 3-Nothing new to report on the cemetery, Eva Activities Association and county on the drain repairs.
- 4-The Health Clinic mobile unit was tied down by Flanagan's on Friday after Thanksgiving.
- 5-At least four of the Volunteer Firemen are planning to take the EMT course in January at Wallace.

New Business:

- 1-Bids have been let on the Eva School gym. Mr. Mobley said that he thought the bleachers were cut from the county's funding and that the Town of Eva might want to help out with this later on.
- 2-Mayor said we need to write a letter about upgrading the VFD.
- 3-The addition to the Health Clinic was discussed. Council members went over the drawings from Medical Center Planning Office as to the requirements: Mr. Mobley passed around copies with estimated cost of a mobile unit; said a unit to our specifications could be ready in two weeks time. Conclusion was that we need more specific requirements from the Medical Center, make sure they are shown to Dr. Michalski. Ask for specific word from them on how they would lay out a 14 or 16x30' building. The Mayor will talk to Marsha Aldridge and find out if it is necessary to have an architect do the layout in order to get State approval. In the meantime Council members should be looking around to see if they can run across a mobile unit about this size.
- 4-Mayor read highlights of the mail received. We are eligible for the Urban Development Grant program and we might want to look into this later on. He read letter about some surplus property from the TVA that we could get through the office of Howard Proctor. Mr. Nichols will try to find out what is available that we might use. The Fire Chief will be asked to contact Mr. Proctor to see if he has a list of what is available.
- 5-Benny and Joe reported on their trip to Priceville to see the demonstration of the new Hurst tool; they also reported on the meeting of the Morgan County Association of Vol. Fire Depts. He said that VFD's are urged to call in to get any calls logged; they were also reminded to call out EMT's.
6. Bills presented for payment were the following: Gen. Fund-Water bills \$13.52; office supplies \$24.28; Net phone bill \$34.89; heater cord repair \$5.13; Clerk's salary for Nov. \$115.07; Breaker \$4.35; Electric bills Town Hall \$28.91; Senior Citizens \$59.86. From Gas Tax Fund street lights \$126.72; From Fire Dept. Funds Diesel fuel for truck \$15; bulbs \$6.50; from Hazard Account Coy Frost \$200.84. Motion offered by Mobley, seconded by Nichols to pay bills; carried. Motion offered by Livingston, seconded by Nichols to be adjourned.
