

Safety Meeting  
December 20, 2001

Minutes of the Town of Eva annual safety meeting with volunteers from the Fire Department, Eva Public Library, Eva Recreation Board, Eva Medical Building, Town Council members, Town of Eva Employees and Morgan County Sheriffs Department held at Bobby's Fisherman Catch at 6:30 p.m. December 20, 2001. Total number present 60.

Mayor called meeting to order, thanked everyone for coming out, asked Mr. Mosteller to ask the blessing and introduced Guest Speaker Eddie Hicks, with the Morgan County Emergency Management Association. Mr. Hicks spoke on the September 11 Terrorist Attack and what EMA is doing to get prepared for such an attack in our area. His major concerns are the plants on the Tennessee River in Decatur, water supply, electrical and medical facilities. He informed everyone of the part they play along with the Sheriffs Department during sever weather in Morgan County and surrounding area.

Mayor reported to everyone that the Town is getting a tone and voice outdoor warning siren, to be located at the school. We hope to purchase two additional sirens in the near future if funds are available for assistance from the County.

Mayor asks anyone present if they had anything to say. Eloise Livingston with the Library Board thanked all the volunteers helping with the Library, gave a brief report on the programs and progress made at the Library this year. She also spoke on behalf of the Medical Board and brought us up to date on activities of the Board.

Ruth Livingston with Nutrition Site gave a report and stated that she had attended a county meeting and was informed that effective next year the site would need an attendance of 25 people per day to continued to stay open.

Sheriff Crabbs thanked everyone for their assistance and stated that he appreciated the Town and the good working relationship between the Town and his staff. He reported that they are about ready to move back into the jail, and that each of the Deputy's now have a laptop computer in patrol cars.

Don Stisher with District Three County Commission thanked the fire department for their help in times of sever weather.

Chief Holmes with the Fire Department reported that it had been a good year for the fire department. He announced that they had their first baby – a boy – at which time he
