

AGENDA - Eva Town Council Meeting December 10, 1987

Old Business

- 1-Signs: Joe Summerford said that he thought he could take care of getting us some speed limit signs. If the Council votes to get the directional signs for overhead at the 4-way stop, that will be the responsibility of the Town. He said that Bob Woodruff orders theirs--they cannot make them in-house. He doesn't know who Bob orders from. Alabama Regulations say they must be green with white lettering; letters have to be at least 10" high; signs must either be reflectorized or illuminated.
- 2-Annexation was approved. Paperwork announcing approval has been sent to Washington-Census Bureau; State Treasurer and Comptroller in Montgomery; and to Decatur: Probate Office, Revenue Commissioner, License Commissioner, County Commission, and Board of Registrars. Annexation brought in 44 households; 135 people.
- 3-Did you meet with Mr. Jones about the landscaping project?
- 4-Did you talk about light for north side of Center parking Lot?
- 5-Could not get anyone to organize the Christmas Parade. If Council will approve one for next year, maybe we can start in time to get it organized.
- 6-Status of mail routes. I phoned Mr. Seals' office; he was out; talked to David Wilburn who has worked on this and familiar with the paperwork. He said that Eva and Falkville routes are in their section, but Vinemont is in Birmingham section. Since this project crosses sectional lines, it must be approved by the Divisional Hq in Birmingham. They sent all the paperwork to Birmingham. Birmingham is doing an economic study and has called them about information on Eva and Falkville routes, and has called Vinemont about their route information. Mr. Wilburn said that 3 protests have been lodged by residents against these changes. He doesn't know how Birmingham will vote on the whole package, but said that he knew it would not be approved unless they could see that it will be cost effective.

New Business:

- 1-Ezra has been unavailable. I got Charlie Poole to put up the sign at the Center. He did not know how much to charge; said that if the Council wanted to pay him something he would be satisfied with whatever it was. He made a trip to our house to get a posthole digger; made a trip to Jack Hopper's for some supplies; put the sign up and painted the posts. He worked 2½ hours; went and got gas and cleaned up the paint brush.
- 2-Girl Scouts/Brownies want to earn a badge for an overnight campout and the Den Mothers want to have this inside the building at the Center. They told Ruth they'd bring their sleeping bags and would clean up when they're ready to leave. They want to do this on Friday night, Jan. 22, and there will be about 40 involved. Ruth needs Council's approval.

Unlit sign, with arrow, with name painted across the top, delivered, anchored w/hurricane ties; 1 year guarantee \$330. Same sign, lighted, same guarantees, with \$50 lettering job, \$360.
