

Minutes of the Meeting of the Eva Town Council held in regular session on June 11, 1981, at 7 p.m., with Councilmen Mobley, Morgan, Nichols and Hipps (part time), attending. The meeting was chaired by Mayor Ryan. Minutes of the June 11 meeting were read and approved. The financial report was accepted as presented, showing the following end-of-June balances:

Anne Harvey from The Decatur Daily was recognized as a visitor to the meeting.

#### Old Business:

1. Roof on Senior Citizens Center porch. The framework was put up, but the tin was not put on. Mr. Hipps said that it was mentioned to come back later and finish.
2. Doctor for Eva. The Mayor reported on the Call Meeting held July 7 with officials from the Hartselle Medical Center, Ronald Sparkman and Marsha Aldridge. He gave some background information to Anne Harvey, and told the Council, for the benefit of those not present at the call meeting, that Hartselle Medical Center will assist us in recruiting a doctor and will guarantee the first-year salary. He believes that with this cooperative agreement on their support, and our providing the facility, that we will soon be successful in finding a physician to practice in Eva.
3. Gasoline Leak. No new problems have developed. The Mayor read from a letter Joe Wheeler Electric Corp. sent to the Civil Defense Office, donating the power consumed by the emergency bus while it was parked here in Eva. He asked that a letter of thanks be sent to Mr. Sharrott at Joe Wheeler.

#### New Business:

1. The Mayor stated that we were planning to pass an ordinance or resolution about the underground tanks; that he was supposed to have picked up a copy of the Cullman City Ordinance, but didn't do it. The matter was tabled for time being.
2. The Mayor stated that he had asked the County Engineer for a price to pave the approximately 3/10 mile by West Side Baptist Church. He said that he doesn't have a figure on that yet, so the matter will have to be voted on at a later meeting.
3. The Mayor read from the UAB letter announcing the Physician's Opportunity Fair to be held on October 2 in Birmingham. The charges for the booths will be \$125 this year. It was thought that since we now have this cooperative arrangement with Hartselle Medical Center to assist us in recruitment, that we might not need to spend the \$125 for a booth at the POF. Mr. Mobley offered the motion, seconded by Nichols, that we not participate in the Physicians Opportunity Fair this year. Motion carried.
4. The Mayor reported that J. C. Fortenberry has offered to sell his Kindergarten Building to the Town of Eva. If they are not interested, he would like to know so that he can put it on the open market. The appraised value at the time he purchased it (which was said to be conservative) was \$46,500. Mr. Fortenberry will negotiate with the Town of Eva on a price. The building has over <sup>8,000</sup> 10,000 square feet of floor space, and the walls are easily moved because of overhead trusses. There is a little more than 6/10 acre of land; stove, refrigerator and some other equipment furnished. The matter had to be tabled because there was not a quorum because Mr. Mobley would abstain; Mr. Livingston was absent, and Mr. Hipps had just been called out of the meeting due to an emergency. The Mayor stated that he would need to appoint a committee/

to check into this with Mr. Fortenberry, but we might have to do this at a call meeting later. Matter was tabled..

5. Bills presented for payment were:

Mr. Nichols offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Morgan that said bills be paid. Motion carried.
