

Minutes of Call Meeting of Eva Town Council held March 17, 1983 at 6 p.m., attended by the Mayor and all five Councilmen. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called to discuss the addition to our Health Clinic, and asked Mr. Mobley to report on what he has found out.

Mr. Mobley mentioned that we had already discussed the bid from Flanagan for a 36 ft. trailer with no lead walls for \$9531. He had called P&S X-Ray in Florence who said that we could get 3'x7' sheets, 1/16" thick for \$120 per sheet for lead shielding. Windows cost from \$300 to \$400 each. He said that he could see no need to have two windows as is specified in the drawing. Delivery for these lead sheets is 3 to 4 weeks.

A&E, Inc. in Decatur (Bill Fite) said that they had it in sheet rock @ \$127.36 per sheet. Another layer of sheet rock would have to go on top of that. Delivery would be about 4 weeks.

Ray said that Everett Aday and Ermord Lindsey have had experience putting up lead sheets.

Mr. Mobley had a call ~~from~~ stating that the company who would build the 36-foot trailer had found a source for the lead walls, and that they would give us a bid of \$15,060 for the trailer, installed, with lead walls.

He, Mitchell and Roland had looked at the 50-ft. trailer for sale in Berlin @ \$3,900 and it appears to be in good shape. After discussion, concensus was that we could get that trailer and hire someone to move it in and do modifications for much less than we could get the new units mentioned above.

Mr. Nichols offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Livingston, that we buy the 50-ft. trailer at Berlin, hire someone to move it in, ~~and~~ tie it down, connect it, ~~and~~ order the lead sheets from Florence. *Motion carried. and hire someone to do required modifications.*

Mr. Mobley said that if we ran into any difficulties in getting the lead sheets installed we could call on P&S X-Ray to come out and help us since they are specialists in the business. Mr. Mobley called Doug Johnson, owner of the 50-ft. trailer in Berlin (734-7984) and told him that we definitely wanted the trailer. He said that he could have the furniture out of it early next week.

Mayor gave a brief report on the meeting with the Morgan County Commission, Sheriff Burgess and the County Lawyer which he, Mr Hipps, Mr. Nichols and Mr. Morgan attended. He said they were given the same proposal that we had discussed; i.e., \$10,000 to buy a car and \$10,000 a year on salary for the deputy and/or upkeep of the equipment. They are going to discuss it and draw up an agreement and get back with us.

Clerk asked the Mayor whether we should contact the Banks again about a possible branch at Eva. He suggested that we wait until we have the deputy thing worked out; then write a letter telling of the things that have changed in the meantime, with the law protection, the health clinic, drug store, etc.
