

Minutes of Meeting of Eva Town Council held in regular session March 13, 1986, at 7 p.m. attended by Mayor Ryan and all five members of the council. Visitor to the meeting was Dr. William R. Hale, a dentist with offices in Huntsville. Motion was offered by Mr Nichols, seconded by Mr. Hipps to dispense with the reading of the minutes until after hearing from Dr. Hale. Mayor then called on Dr. Hale to speak to the council to indicate his interest in locating a parttime office in Eva. He has been in Huntsville since 1956, offices are open from 7 to 5 4 days a week (Mon-Thurs), leaving time to do some farming at Valhermoso where he lives. He needs office space where he can install dental equipment with water lines, air lines, etc. This would require at least crawl space, but really would like to have a basement where the lines could be easily worked on. He will have compressors, suction, dryers. He needs to know how this would work with a septic tank. If he could get set up, he would allot 2 days a week at Eva and if things worked out well, he might consider getting someone to work with him and expand the time in Eva. It costs him \$150 an hour to open his doors in Huntsville. He wants Town of Eva to supply him with some population figures; the bank's survey figures would be okay, plus mean income of census area, and any information pertinent to his interests in establishing a business in Eva. Clerk will compile some information and get it to him. His addresses: Rt. 2, Box 931, Lacey's Spring, AL 35754; Huntsville Office: 2333 Pansy Street, Huntsville, AL 35801. He then left the meeting.

- 4-Voted to ask Gloria Winton from Cobbs Accounting to come out to discuss doing an audit. (Motion Hipps; second Livingston; carried.)
- 5-Discussed the stack of tires in front of Eva Tire Co. Talked about perhaps writing him a letter to get them moved before summer because this would start mosquitos with water standing in the tires. Mayor said that he might get a chance to talk to him.
- 6-Voted to send North Alabama Mental Health Center \$101 for this fiscal year. (Motion Nichols; second Morgan; carried.)
- 7-Mr. Hipps offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Livingston to pay the bills and to transfer funds as required. Bills to be paid were presented as follows: From General Fund: Deputy Salary for March \$875; Computer teacher salary for March \$750; Interest on Loan (aprx) \$196; Petrolane Gas for Senior Center \$198; Water bills Town Hall \$18.98; Sr. Ctr. \$8.84; Electric Bills (approximate) Town Hall \$75; Sr. Center \$50; Library \$15.50; Repairs to copying machine \$30; Office supplies and storage boxes for files \$55.08; Phone Bills \$74.30; Children's table for Library \$30; Guest book for Library \$6.75; Extra keys for library workers \$4.53; 1985-86 contribution to Mental Health \$101; Clerk's salary for Feb. \$410.87. From Vol. Fire Dept Fund: Cal-Gas \$309; Gas & Oil for trucks \$38.15; radio repairs \$4; Flowers for Ruth Moses' funeral \$25. From Gasoline Tax Fund: Street lights (aprx) \$140.
