

Agenda for Eva Town Council Meeting 9-8-88

Old Business

- 1-Any word on highway signs? Mail routes?
- 2-Driveway extension for ROJO Mfg. Co.?
- 3-Landscaping projects at school (Ford) and Clinic, Library, bank (Morris).
(We have a letter from John Smith saying he does not plan to bid.)
- 4-Clerk still has not checked about the overdue book situation.
- 5-Culverts and ditches; road at Stacy's property line.
- 6-I got the \$9 check back for the zip code directory, with a note saying the 1988 directories are \$13.00. Should I re-order at the new price?

New Business

- 1-Agreement with Hartselle Medical Center
- 2-Working on budget. Any special items to be included? Street repairs \$20,000.
Talked with Willa Dockery who said that insurance, retirement, etc., has gone up again on county employees. With leaving Ruth's salary @ \$4.00/hr which is the salary of all employees in her category, the benefits increases will cause our pay to the county to increase from \$477.35/month to \$514.01/month. Sheriff's Dept. is asking for a 10% increase in deputies' wages. That, with the increase in insurance/benefits would bring our payment to the county on the deputy from \$1100/month to \$1210/month. If Council agrees to these increases, this would become effective Oct. 1.
- 3-Our TVA payments were \$609.92/month this year; will be increased to \$655.58 for 1989.
- 4-Alabama League Agreement to collect delinquent license taxes from insurance companies, retaining 50% to pay the firm and sending 50% to municipality. Does Town of Eva want to participate? Do we have enough insurances operating here to justify this?
- 5-Eva School priority list for school year 1988-89.
- 6-Would Council authorize having the annual BBQ supper for Eva VFD members/families and Library volunteers/families? Would Sat., Oct. 1, 6:30 PM be all right? Should we invite Morgan County Commission and deputies?
- 7-Jerry Harrison, Chairman of GROWL for Morgan County, is going before the County Commission on Monday, Sept. 12, 10 A.M. to urge the county to enforce the litter laws. He went to a state-wide meeting in Birmingham recently about the litter problem, and several of the counties have already tightened down on this and are encouraging all counties in Alabama to enforce the litter laws. With ALABAMA REUNION 1989, the state is hoping to have a beautiful and clean state. Mr. Harrison wants as much support as he can get at this meeting Monday. Community Pride Chairman Kermit Morris is planning to go; maybe Conard Self. Can anyone from the Town Council attend? It will be in the Commission Conference Room, 5th floor of the Courthouse.
- 8-Larry McDearmond has done all the caulking around windows and doors at Library; has put on one coat of the latex stain. Before he puts on the 2d coat, is the color O.K.? He will also paint the letters, around the windows, trim and entrance way. His bill is the following:
