Minutes of Eva Town Council called meeting on October 31, 2006, at 4:45 p.m. at the Eva Town Hall, present: Mayor Gary Livingston, Council Members Kent Chambers, Cleo Alexander, Johnny Persall, James Henderson, Bert Collins and Town Clerk Judy Fortenberry.

Guest: Stanley Smith, Ladd Environmental Consultants, Inc.

Mayor Livingston called the meeting to order at 4:45, after roll call Mayor Livingston informed the council the reasons for the call meeting.

Mayor Livingston asked Mr. Smith about the cost of running the sewer line to the Town Hall at this time. Mr. Smith informed Mayor Livingston that they had purchased three pumps for the old furniture store, but have found out since that they only need one, one of the pumps will be used at the building next to G. C. Childers building, since no pump was ordered for this location, at the time it was assumed the septic tank for the Childers building was also for the building next door, which was not the case. The extra pump could be used to a run line to the Town Hall, which is having septic tank problems at this time. Mr. Smith stated he thinks the extra line will cost no more than \$7,500 and there is a chance that with the under runs on the pipe and with the extra pump that we may not have any extra cost.

After a lengthy discussion Mr. Collins motion to go with the line to the Town Hall, Mr. Alexander seconded, carried.

Mr. Smith also, suggested that we get with the Morgan County Board of Education and see if they would like to have the Contractor that is installing the line to install the line from the Eva School pump to the sewer plant. He feels that this will save the school money and feels the present contractor will better understand what is needed to hook-up the system. Mayor Livingston will get with Don Murphy with the Morgan County Board of Education on the morning of November 1, to see if they want to talk with the contractor about installing this line. Clerk will check with Ladd Environmental to see if we need to do a change order for this work.

Mr. Smith also, stated that we need to know what to do about the Woodard Building at the intersection, since this building is in such disrepair and up for sale do we feel it is in the best interest of the Town to install a pump at this time. Also it was stated that the septic tank cannot be found at this location because of the trash and junk at the back of the building.

Stanley Smith left the meeting at 5:36 p.m.

Mr. Henderson motion to go into executive session, Mr. Persall seconded, carried.

Mr. Chambers's motion to come out of executive session, Mr. Henderson seconded, carried.

Mayor Livingston reported to the Council that he had talked with Larry Madison, Town's Attorney, about the performance of the employee hired to run the sewer plant. He informed Mr. Madison of the employee's failure to pass the certification test three times, that in fact the last time he took the test he made less than the time before. Mayor informed Mr. Madison that the council was in agreement to give this employee a months pay, pay his insurance for a month, and will not contest his unemployment. Mr. Madison felt this is well within the town's legal obligation to this employee.

Mr. Persall motion to terminate Tommy Shickles from our employment on November 3, 2006, with pay through December 9, 2006, and insurance for the month of November 2006, and the town will not contest his unemployment, Mr. Collins seconded, Mayor put to vote five (5) yea's – one (1) abstained Mayor, carried.

Clerk will make out three checks to Mr. Shickles, all post dated, and Mayor Livingston and Mr. Henderson will meet with Mr. Shickles at 3:30 p.m. on Friday November 3, 2006.

Mr. Chamber's motion to adjourn, Mr. Alexander seconded, carried.
