

EVA TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

MAY 14, 1990

CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Ryan

ATTENDED BY: Mayor Ryan, Charles Nichols, Donald Ray Morgan, Alton Page, and Debra Pruitt, Clerk.

Prayer by Mayor Ryan.

Minutes and Treasurer's Report read and approved by Council.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Recreation Park- Members from the Activity Association Committee were invited to the meeting but none were present. The excavation work on the ballfields have been completed and the committee from the Town Council was satisfied with the Hooten's work. They voted unanimously to give Mr. Hooten his final payment of \$7,450.00. (M:Donald Ray;S:Charles;Carried).

Bid opening date on the Walking Trail Project will be June 7, 1990 at 1:30 p.m. Mayor requested this be posted at, at least 3 business in town three weeks before opening date.

2. Medical Clinic- The Council discussed to possibilities of recruiting another doctor. Mayor Ryan has been in contact with Steve Dean, who is actively pursuing a new doctor for the town.
3. E-911- The letter from the Morgan County Emergency Management Chairman that was read at the May 9th meeting was read to the Council again by Mayor Ryan. The Council passed a Resolution giving the E-911 Board the approval to give a unique address for every residence and business within the City Limits. (M:Alton;S:Charles;Carried)

OTHER BUSINESS:

1. Lindley estate ask city to fill the old pond on that property as was once requested by the city. However, since it was not approved for the city to fill the pond at that time the city had to spend approx. \$2,000. on drainage tiles around the cemetery. Since the drainage problem no longer exist the City Council could not justify funding the project.
2. Alton reported that he had talked to several individuals at the Post Office Dept. concerning changing routes. They will want to meet with the Council to discuss it further.
