

Minutes of the meeting of the Eva Town Council on March 10, 1994, at the Eva Town Hall with the following present: Mayor Livingston, Charles Nichols, Afton Fowler, Clarence Alexander, and Eloise Livingston, Chairman of Library Board. Late arrival was Larry Smith and Bert Collins, After roll call by Mayor, the meeting was opened by prayer from Mr. Nichols. Mr. Alexander made a motion to dispense of the reading of the minutes to hear the Library report, Mr. Fowler, second, carried.

Mrs. Livingston gave monthly report (copy of file with Clerk) and advised the Council that the head librarian, Ann Childers, was not able to attend to all requirements of her position due to sickness and other personal commitments. She ask that the Council recommend Bonnie Holmes to be head librarian since she was there most of the time and made sure that the mail was picked up daily and handled. Mayor suggested that Mrs. Livingston discuss the matter with Mrs. Childers first and then the Council would make a recommendation. Mr. Alexander made a motion that the Mayor make this recommendation, Mr. Fowler, second, carried.

After reading of the minutes, Mr. Fowler made motion to approve, Mr. Alexander, second, carried.

1. FINANCE/EDUCATION

-Mr. Nichols stated that he did not have a report. After council reviewed the financial report, Mayor advised the C.D. had been reinvested with the First Bank of Eva. He had contacted 6 different banks and they have the best offer. Two banks did not respond.

2. UTILITIES

- Mr. Alexander reported that at the Old Town Hall there was a hole in the wall where a gas heater had been removed. He had ask Mike Hopper to give an estimate on repair. Mr Fowler suggested that the hole be temporarily covered and not permanant so that it could be used for the winter months in case a gas heater was needed for the area.

- Mr. Alexander reported that Jerry Vanderbilt had moved into the Willard Casey resident and there was several pot holes in the driveway (Town right-of-way). Mayor ask Mr. Fowler to look at the area before a decision is made.

- Mr. Alexander stated that the Art Guild wanted to purchase a 16 x 20 storage building and could it be placed on Town property to store items used at Frontier Days? Mayor advised that the Town could not contribute to a private agency.

- Also reported that water was standing in several areas in the cemetary and several citizens were concerned. Since the low area was near the road and if dirt was placed there to raise it, then the water would stand in the road. Mayor said he would talk to Joe Sumerford concerning assistance to grade the road.

3. STREETS/PARKS/CEMETARIES

- Mr. Fowler stated that right-of-way at John's Junque had been repaired. He also stated there was many roads that needed stripping and paving in the Town, the walking trail had several areas washing, and the bulkhead area was washing at the Library. Mayor advised Mr. Fowler to get estimates on wash repair at the Library and he (Mayor) would meet with Joe Sumerford for his advise on all road repairs. He advised Council that the Town had to have clear deeds with right-of-ways before any paving. Mr. Fowler presented a list to

the Council for priority on roads in the Town. Mayor suggested that a work night be set and all councilman take the list and make recommendations as to needs of the Town with the revenue at the present time. (A work night would be set at a later date.)

4. POLICE/FIRE

- Mr. Smith advised that in the area of Foodland and Hopper Building Supply was quite a lot of speeding and wreckless driving and would like special attention to the area by the Deputy. He also advised that Ray Cheatham is checking on the defibrillator (item to hook up to patients in case of heart trouble) cost for the Fire Department.

- Mr. Smith advised there are new houses at the end of Stacey road, which is in Town limits, and they plan to run 6" water lines down the road to furnish the 4 houses. Mr. Nichols made motion to install hydrant, Mr. Alexander, second, carried. Mayor advised that the water line would have to be on right-of-way and need to plan the water line and hydrant connection at the same time.

5. RECREATION/SANITATION

- Mr. Collins advised that he and the Mayor were planning a meeting with Tom Drake, Representative for the area, concerning any possible funding or grants, etc that could be used for the sewer system and to widen the street at the four-way stop for turn lanes. Also he would talk with Mr. Drake about the defibrillator needed for the Fire Department. Mayor advised that he had received information concerning a possible grant for Park & Recreation and that a workshop would be held on March 24 & 25. Mr. Collins made motion for clerk to attend and the Town pay expenses to cover attendance and file a letter of intent, Mr. Nichols second, carried.

- Mr. Collins also reported that Mr. Miner, who lives next to the park, would like to put out some trees for the park, pines or etc. Mayor advised that the Girl Scouts needed a project planting trees and would check into the project.

8. HEARING ON PETITIONS, APPLICS, COMPLAINTS, APPEALS, COMMUCS., ETC.

- Mayor advised that he had be approached about selling the property owned by the Town located by the Church of Christ. After discussion, the Council agreed that the property was purchased for future use and not for resale.

- Mayor advised that the curbs had been taken care of at Spices of Life.

- Mayor advised that he would like to shorten the Council meetings by making reports brief and needed to start at 7:30 since Larry Smith and Bert Collins could not be there at 7:00.

- Mayor advised he had contacted David Loving, Administrator of Hartselle Hospital, concerning a doctor for the area and also concerning the matter of the Medical Office Building, but Mr. Loving had still not made any committment in either situation. Mr. Nichols made motion for Mayor to meet with the Medical Board and for them (Mayor & Medical Board) to make necessary steps to make situa-tion legally right, Mr. Fowler second, carried.



ON THE 31ST DAY OF DECEMBER OF EACH YEAR, OR WITHIN SIXTY DAYS THEREAFTER, EACH INSURANCE COMPANY, OR PERSON ENGAGED IN SUCH BUSINESS, SHALL FURNISH THE TOWN CLERK A STATEMENT, IN WRITING, DULY AUTHORIZED AND CERTIFIED BY SOMEONE AUTHORIZED TO MAKE THE SAME, SHOWING THE FULL AND TRUE GROSS AMOUNT OF SUCH PREMIUMS, LESS RETURN PREMIUMS, RECEIVED DURING THE YEAR, AND SHALL ACCOMPANY SUCH STATEMENT WITH THE AMOUNT OF LICENSE DUE ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE. A FAILURE TO FURNISH SUCH STATEMENT SHALL CONSTITUTE JUST CAUSE TO DELCINE ISSUANCE OF A LICENSE TO SUCH PERSON.

YOUR LICENSE OR THE CALENDAR YEAR 1992 TOGETHER WITH A RECEIPT WILL BE SENT BY RETURN MAIL.

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
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
