Minutes of Meeting of Eva Town Council held in Regular Session May 12, 1983, at 7 p.m., attended by Mayor Ryan and Councilmen Mobley, Hipps, Livingston and Morgan. Minutes of the regular meeting of April 14 and call meetings of April 16 and 27 were read and approved. Financial report was received, giving the following balances:

## Old Business:

- 1-Sewing Factory. Dwight said that as a temporary thing he would move the industry into the Nails Store Building. Steve Cooley and ADO people are checking into what might be available to us for this, per report from the Mayor.
- 2-Livingston Estate. Mr. Mobley said that he, Mr. Nichols and Mr. Hipps looked at the Livingston place and their recommendation is to try to buy it if we can legally do so. His suggestions was to buy the whole plot and recoup some by selling the surplus property across the highway that would not be needed for the recreational area/park. Clerk will prepare letter to Attorney General's Office asking for an opinion in the matter.
- 3-Health Clinic Addition. New drawings are not back yet from architect. Mayor reported that the Frost Bros. have torn out the far partition and took up the carpets which is as far as they can go until we get the approved drawings. Mayor read over a list of suggestions made by Dr. Michalski (copy attached). Leaks in addition were discussed. Council voted to have the AGS Movers to come out to fix the leaks. Clerk will call them.
- 4-Eva Cemetery. No one on the Council was contacted by Paul Lindler over the weekend when he said he would be up here for Decoration. Clerk was asked to prepare a letter asking what their decision is about draining the pond.

## New Business:

- 1-Norris Turney, NARCOG, reported that everything looked okay during their inspection of the Senior Citizens Center except the interior which needs painting. He said that they would furnish the paint if we could hire someone to paint it. Mr. Hipps agreed to do the painting and will let the Clerk know aprx. how much paint to ask NARCOG to get for the job.
- 2-Mayor read a notice from the Library on Wheels about the Summer Reading Program to be held each Monday in June at 10:30 a.m. It is planned to hold these meetings under the trees near the Library. Council voted to let them use Town Hall conference room in case of rain.
- 3-Council voted to try to get Robert Nobinger to spray the chemical weed control around all fire hydrants, stop signs, and the ditch where the cattails are so bad.
- 4-Bills presented for payment were the following:  
General Fund: 2 water bills @ \$7.80; Kindergarten teacher's salary for May \$1141.59; Net phone bill \$59.30; Petrolane Gas at Eva Sr. Citizens Center \$197.34; Ray's Refrigeration Service for connecting the airconditioning system at Health Clinic \$64.35; Robert Nobinger for clearing away the trees and brush around the Clinic \$35.00; Clerk's salary for April \$143.99; Electric Bills: Senior Citizens Center \$57.60 and Town Hall \$23.68.  
Volunteer Fire Dept.: Motorola for pagers, batteries and rechargers \$1408; 6 mos. premium on 1960 Dodge Truck \$54.90; Gasoline Tax Fund: Street Lights \$125.91.  
Mr. Mobley offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Morgan to pay the bills. Motion carried. There being no further business, Mr. Mobley offered the motion, seconded by Mr. Hipps that the meeting be adjourned.

Suggestions from Dr. Michalski (as given by Nurse Templeton) inre Health Clinic

1. Remove musty carpet rolled up in addition; thinks it unusable and should be disposed of.
2. Put large sheet of plastic over that hole between Waiting Room and addition. Airconditioning is "leaking out" through that hole, making it hot in the Waiting Room.
3. Draperies need to be cleaned and cut off to fit windows.
4. May need Pest Control for termites and roaches?
5. If possible, put roof over whole building (will act as extra insulation and stop all the leaks.).
6. Nice idea if there are some old lawn chairs available to put out under the trees near the Library on Wheels.
