



# Lu, Leslie Lam

Mr. Leslie Lu received his Master of Architecture Degree from Yale University in 1977, and was the recipient of the Japan Ministry of Culture Monbusho Scholarship 1983, where he conducted research in design and urban theory in Tokyo, Japan.

Mr. Lu is currently the Head of the Department of Design, Hong Kong Design Institute. Prior to the present role, he served as the Head of the Department of

Architecture, The University of Hong Kong; Chairman of the Faculty Board, Faculty of Architecture, Director of Graduate Studies, and Acting Dean of the Faculty on numerous occasions.

Professionally, Mr. Leslie Lu practiced with Cesar Pelli and Associates, Hardy Holzman Pfeiffer Associates, and Kohn Pedersen Fox Associates. During his Monbusho Scholarship research studies in Japan, he worked with Shinohara Kazuo on the design of the Centennial Hall in the Tokyo Institute of Technology. The Centennial Hall, The Museum of Modern Arts [MOMA] in New York City, together with 333 Wacker Drive Building in Chicago is widely acknowledged by the public and the media as representative architecture of the millennium.

Mr. Lu was Visiting Professor at Yale University and Delft University of Technology, and was assistant lecturer for the Eero Saarinen Chair at Yale University. Mr. Lu lectured and served as design critic in major international universities including Columbia University, Delft University of Technology, Princeton University, Yale University, Shenzhen University, Tongji University and Tsinghua University.

In 2004, Mr. Lu's design works and competition entry for the Hong Kong West Kowloon Reclamation Concept Plan Design Competition was selected for exhibition in the 2004 Beijing Biennale.

In 2009, Mr. Lu's arts installation, entitled "Infinite Constellation" is exhibited as a permanent installation for the Hong Kong Pavilion, EXPO 2010, Shanghai, China.

The Fuji Kindergarten takes the form of a 200m-circumference oval-shaped roof space. Woods of Net, 320 cubic meter of timber members are used and there is nothing same among all the 589 members.

He is President of The Architectural League of New York, has served as the Vice President for Design Excellence at the AIA NY Chapter, and is a member of the Visiting Committee to Harvard University's Graduate School of Design. In 2001 Mr. Tsao was inducted into the Interior Design Hall of Fame, and in 2009 he received the Cooper-Hewitt

National Design Award for Interior Design, along with his partner Zack McKown. A Fellow of the American Institute of Architects, he has taught at the Harvard Graduate School of Design and at the Parsons School of Design, and has served as guest critic and design juror at universities and institutes nationwide.

Congratulations to all of this year's winners of the Asia Pacific Interior Design Award. Your accomplishments clearly demonstrate that Hong Kong is at a tipping point in its history, with the potential to become a world leader in design.

Now, as never before, Hong Kong can control its own destiny. Freed from colonial obstacles, and having come to understand the great synergies inherent in our relationship with the mother country, Hong Kong is poised to use its great will, pragmatism, and sophistication to forge its own history. Tempered by the adversities of the past, but as a young society, less encumbered by social complexities that slow advancement in older societies, Hong Kong is now ready and mightily prepared to come into its own as a vibrant and self-aware culture with confidence in its future -- a well-founded confidence that attracts and inspires long-term personal investment in the community.

Design leaders must truly know the cultures that they serve. From here we can know a great many. As one of the world's most important trading centers over the last several decades, and unquestionably the world's primary crossroads between East and West, the people of Hong Kong have been exposed to a greater diversity of cultures than perhaps any other place on earth. Consequently, we have developed sophistication and worldliness far beyond what I think most of us realize.

So, Hong Kong is, indeed, very well equipped to make great strides, but to truly maximize our potential, I believe Hong Kong should invest significantly more in the education of designers, artists and writers. The market will always be the main spring board, of course, but the community's increased investment in the teaching of literature, history, and the arts can have catalytic effects to make much more of the opportunities ahead. This is so because it is the designers, artists, and writers who are the first to see, and then to communicate a culture's understanding of itself back to the community and to the world. That vital dialogue advances a culture by helping it to understand where it is currently headed, and where it could be headed. To understand the importance of investment in the individuals who together form society's mirror, we should also imagine all that could be missed out, or what dangers could come when a society's mirror is cloudy or broken.

# Ben van Berkel

Co-founder UNStudio / Principal Architect



Ben van Berkel studied architecture at the Rietveld Academy in Amsterdam and at the Architectural Association in London, receiving the AA Diploma with Honours in 1987. His first projects were built almost immediately after founding Van Berkel & Bos Architectuur Bureau. Among the buildings of this first period are Karbouw, the Remu electricity station, and Villa Wilbrink. Being elected to design the Erasmus Bridge in Rotterdam (1996) profoundly affected his understanding of the role of the architect today and constituted the foundation

of his collaborative approach to practising, leading to the foundation of UNStudio in 1999.

In the interim a blue period resulted in the realization of projects such as The Moebius House, Het Valkhof Museum (1998), and the Prince Claus Bridge (2003). Recent projects, which reflect his longstanding interest in the integration of construction and architecture, are: the Mercedes-Benz Museum in Stuttgart and Arnhem Central. He has been visiting lecturer at Princeton and had taught at Columbia University, the Berlage Institute and UCLA. He is currently Professor of Conceptual Design and head of the architecture department at the Staedelschule in Frankfurt am Main (Germany). Ben van Berkel has co-authored a significant number of essays and monographs.

I am delighted to have been invited to be on the panel of judges for this year's APIDA awards. Such awards can stimulate originality and healthy competition, as well as encourage the world of interior and product design to continue working towards new ideas and production techniques. I do not often take part in selection juries, however I firmly believe that it is very important to stimulate our profession in this way and the APIDA awards are an excellent and prestigious example of how this can be done. So I am really excited and very much looking forward to taking part in the selection of this year's winning designers and their projects.

Yuko Hasegawa is a Chief Curator of the Museum of Contemporary Art, Tokyo (MOT) and also a professor of the Department of Art Science, Tama Art University in Tokyo. She was a Founding Artistic Director of 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, Kanazawa. Since 2001, she serves as an International Arts Advisory Council for the Wexner Center for the Arts. And from 2008 she is the member of Asian Art Council at Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum (US), the board member of the West Kowloon Cultural District

Authority (HK), and the Artistic Director of Inujima House Project (JP).
