PUBLIC WORKS

- i. Action: Casey's Engineering Plans and stormwater report for review/approval
- Lauren, here as a representation of the project for Casey's
 - Here for any questions or to give answers

- Westfall, are you an engineer?
- Lauren, License engineer, if approved, put my stamp, send village copies
- Westfall, retention pond
- Lauren: (Described the pond, on the pamphlets provided to the board)
 - o Narrow sliver on the west side and north shallow, large, not very deep
 - o Provide the report to the county for review and had no comments
- Westfall questioned if Lauren was Artech for drawing
- Lauren, no, done by a different company
- The mayor questioned Lauren about how they came up with the numbers: a special evaluation?
- Lauren, two different elevations, all storm
 - o 5 minutes to 48 hours
 - o Make sure it's safe for runoff
 - o Basin might become overwhelmed, but the storm will not
 - o 100-year 5-minute storm
 - o Bolton 75 most current rainfall data
- Mayor, that is good to know. I have no further questions
- Jagers, I have no questions
- Mayor, questioned Lauren if she mainly works with just Casey's?
- Lauren, mainly in the Midwest with Caseys
 - o Southern IL with Dollar Generals
 - o Some local Culver's
 - Happy to work with anyone who would be buying the west piece of the new Caseys
 - o It is very beneficial that Casey bought all twenty-two acres
 - o Biggest competitors are sales of pizza, coffee, donuts, and typical fast food
- Westfall, preliminary review till Lauren stamp seals
- Lauren, conditions to safeguard
- Mayor, do not want to hold up Casey's
- Lauren, going to close early 2026, do the quick claim deed

Motioned: Burton and Jagers seconded Casey's Engineering plans and stormwater report for approval, with a conditional receiving stamp seal from the engineer and a building seal from the architect. Burton, Westfall, Rahn-Absent, Stage, Jagers. DeSmith. Motion carried: 5– AYES; 0 – NAYS.

- DeSmith, Jacob, started today. Scott took him around
- Mayor, I think Bob Floming did too
- Bob Floming, good kid, knows his stuff
 - o Leave him be, let him do his stuff, of what he knows
 - o Gave him a long list of things to do

- Jacob said he is pleased with how we are set up. He is going to be an excellent asset
- Mayor, Jake, did ask if we would continue to use TEST
 - o I would have to have a recommendation from Joe to turn him loose; that would be less on TEST,
 - o TEST is a good insurance policy
- Westfall, as much turnover we have had, we should keep TEST
- Scott agrees with Bob Floming on everything
- Mayor, update on the muffin monster?
- Thomas, have not received any, will call MVP and check on it tomorrow
- Jagers questioned Bob Floming if they ever kept a list of maintenance on equipment
- Bob Floming, records on the two wells, the date when we put them in

PARKS & RECREATION

- Jagers, decorating the weekend before Thanksgiving
- Mayor questioned Scott about anything to report regarding your surgery
- Scott, I return on the 17th, no more doctor's appointments
- DeSmith, two people with a boom truck to put up lights

PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY

- Stage, Chief Burroughs provided his monthly report
- Chief Burroughs mentioned at the last meeting hiring a new officer at Excel
 - o I would like to hire Justin Fox, who currently works for the sheriff's office
- Mayor, stated to Chief Burroughs, "I know you have been having family issues, hope everything is ok, and gets better."
- Stage, I gave the police schedule to Thomas before the meeting for the month

Motioned: Stage and Jagers seconded to hire Justin Fox based on Chief Burroughs' recommendation. Burton, Westfall, Rahn-Absent, DeSmith, Stage, Jagers. Motion carried: 5 – AYES; NAYS;

TIF

- i. Action: TIF Reimbursement Breakdown
- Burton, we can't vote on anything tonight due to Rahn not being here.
- Mayor, since Rahn is gone, there is no quorum
 - o I want to say, since it's already been voted on for the reimbursement, it can be reimbursed. Thomas probably knows more about it and can answer it

- Thomas, the TIF reimbursement breakdown that Burton is speaking of, cannot be voted on
 - Gwen had a phone call with Burton and myself and strongly suggested having a cap of some sort for the TIF reimbursement.
 - o her actual words were: If there was a cap amount, and a reimbursement amount cap because people can't keep coming back for more money
 - o Burton came up with these TIF reimbursement numbers, and I typed them up
 - Mayor, what you were speaking of is Andy's reimbursement amount that the TIF committee has already approved, which is on the bills to be approved to pay tonight.
- Burton, the reimbursement will have to be building by building
 - Every building is different
- DeSmith, still need a guideline, I like this one
- Andy, Gus building he is currently doing is ½ the size of mine
 - o Every project is different, based on size
 - o 100% on Gus project, does his whole project
 - o 100% on my project, covers a ½ of mine
 - o My building 4 times the size of Gus building
- DeSmith, makes sense what Andy says
- Andy, that doesn't fit for everyone the same way
- Westfall, Other financing program
- Mayor, revolving loan, low interest
- Westfall, apply for that
 - O You must have "skin in the game"
- Mayor, nothing can be voted on tonight, it's for your information
- Burton, Gwen, wants the total amount when applying
- Andy, if you can't vote tonight, I will be at a standstill
 - o The construction company will have to stop, I can't put in \$100,000 into a building, not knowing if maybe we will or maybe we will not reimburse
 - o If he doesn't start this week, then he has to wait till spring, but then that's when the sidewalk is being redone, and then he cannot do the front of the building
- DeSmith, the city is on hold with streets right now
- Burton, we have no idea when the streets are going to get done now
- Westfall, it will not be till next spring, Burton agreed
- Mayor, this summer or more into fall
- DeSmith, we cannot vote tonight anyway
- Andy, any suggestions or thoughts on how to proceed?
- Burton, must wait two weeks before we can vote on anything
- DeSmith, I think you go ahead and schedule it
- Andy, was going to start on Wednesday
- DeSmith, no street work is going on anytime soon; you have plenty of time to get it done
- Mayor, if they did adopt TIF reimbursement, would you continue the work?

- Westfall, we must consider the amount of money
 - o We cannot pour 3-4 hundred thousands of dollars on every building
- Mayor, your value would also be larger
 - Ouestioned Andy if he is planning on having a bar?
- Andy, no
 - o Had two people inquire about the kitchen
- ii. Action: Amend Andy's current application into 30K increments
- Burton cannot vote tonight. Gwen wants full numbers, then a drawdown

FARM REFUSE & RECYCLING

- i. Update from Dennis Walsh
- Mayor, Email update from Dennis Walsh
 - o Happy he has been in contact with Phil
- Westfall questioned Thomas if she had received any garbage bids.
- Thomas, we have received one from LRS
- Jagers, questioned only one?
- Thomas, reminded that we have till the 17th of November to receive them, we still have some time.
- Mayor, did receive a phone call from Matt from Republic
 - States will outdo any other service
 - Would like to stay with us
 - o Might not be the lowest bid, but will be better service than anyone else
- Stage, questioned Scott, garbage can by concession stand
 - o Was full, who dumps that?
- Scott, is to be dumped into the dumpster
- Mayor, have not had any workers to dump it

BILLS

Motioned: Westfall and Stage seconded that all bills be paid as presented, \$56,886.47. Burton, Westfall, Rahn-Absent, DeSmith, Stage, Jagers. Motion carried: 5 – AYES; NAYS;

OTHER ITEMS

- Mayor, Kenny McBride dumped a whole tree at the dump site
 - o I called him out on it
 - o 4-5 big loads
 - o If we wanted him to pick it up or pay

- Wanted to know if we wanted them to pick it up or pay?
- Bob Floming, let them take it
- Mayor, it's good firewood, but not supposed to be bigger than 16 inches
- Bob Floming, did he charge for disposal? If so, then charge him
- Westfall, charge them, they will not do it again
 - o \$250.00 is a fair charge
- DeSmith, I have a big tree. What do I do with the big stump
- Mayor, we do not allow it
