Academic Integrity and the Use of Artificial Intelligence

HUF defines Unauthorized Content Generation (UCG) as “the production of academic work, in whole or part, for academic credit, progression or award, whether or not a payment or other favor is involved, using unapproved or undeclared human or technological assistance” (Foltynek et al., 2023).

This may include essay mills, contract cheating, or the abuse of Artificial Intelligence, including using Artificial Intelligence to fabricate data. Generative Artificial intelligence (e.g. ChatGPT, DeepSeek, Gemini etc.) is a rapidly evolving field and could potentially pose challenges for academic integrity. In the context of academic integrity certain tools are normally acceptable for example spelling checkers, thesaurus and proofreading tools.

An Artificial Intelligence tool can be referenced but not listed as an author as it cannot take responsibility for content generated or conclusions, or findings.
