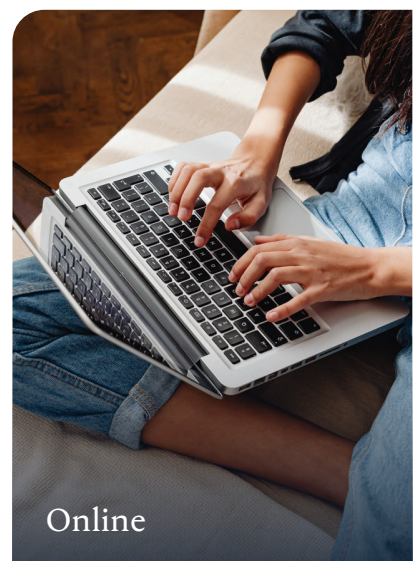

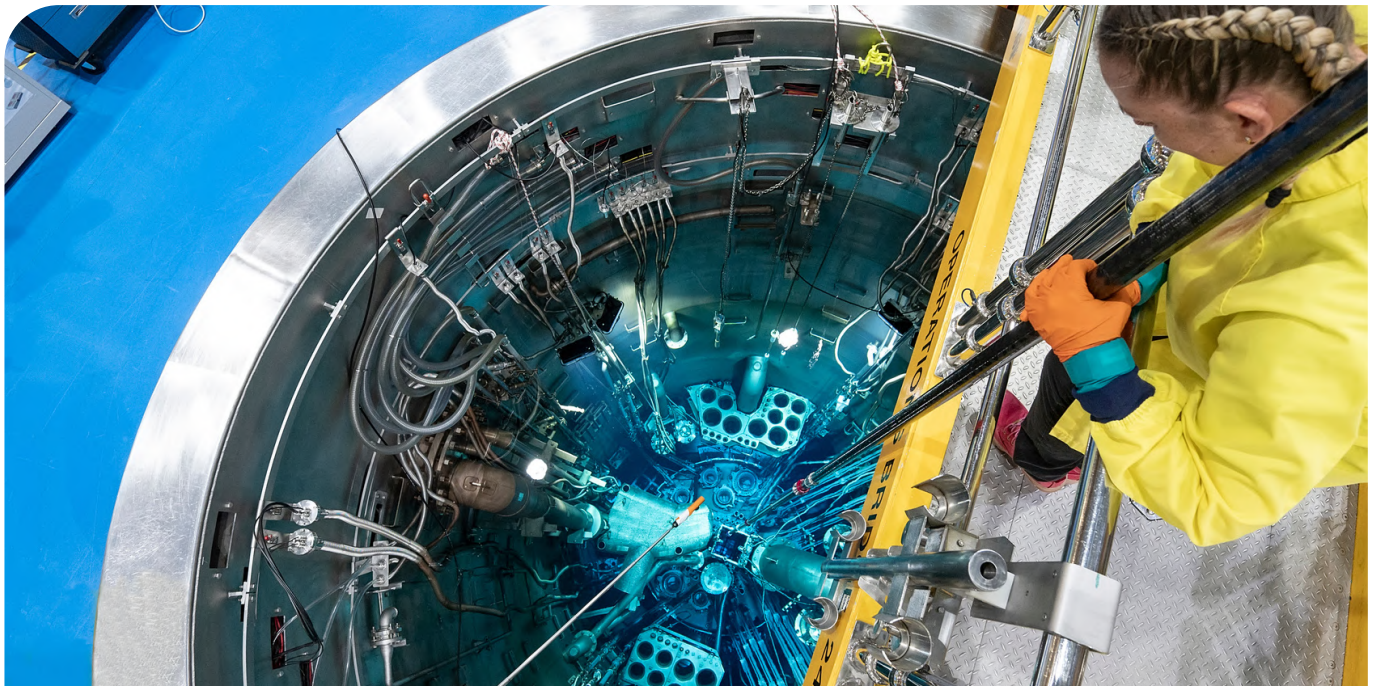

WHAT IT IS

One tutor, one research question, 10 to 15 hours of tutorials. You choose the subject, the question and the start date, and you finish with a real research project.

WHO IT SUITS

You're ambitious and want to explore a subject in greater depth and at your own pace. It's the route to building an application around independent work, intellectual curiosity, and going beyond the expected.

Course structure

Regular 1:1 tutorials are delivered online, alongside independent research between sessions. Tutorials are tailored to your progress and development.

A finished research paper

Literature review, method, analysis and a written evaluation from your tutor.

An optional route to publication

Journal selection, formatting and revision to reviewer comments. Submission is guaranteed; acceptance is at the journal's discretion.

The route from question to research paper.

You'll usually begin with an interest in a subject, not yet a research question. Your first task, with your tutor, is to turn that interest into something specific you can start to build upon.

- 01 Find the question**
Two sessions narrowing a broad interest into a question with a findable answer.
- 02 Read what exists**
A literature review, so you know which part of the argument is genuinely yours.
- 03 Choose a method**
How you will gather evidence, and why that approach stands up to scrutiny.
- 04 Draft and redraft**
Written in sections, each one returned with your tutor's comments.
- 05 Finish, or submit**
A polished paper. On the publication route, a journal submission and the reviewer replies that follow.

What makes a good question

A good research question is focused enough to answer with accessible evidence, but broad enough to produce a meaningful insight. Your tutor helps you strike that balance.

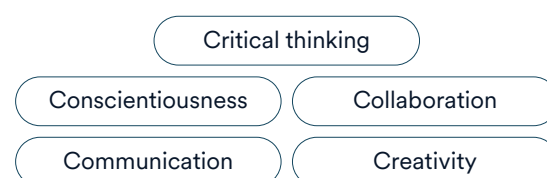


THE EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING FRAMEWORK

What is a mentor?

Closest to a residential advisor or RA in the US system, but assigned to a small group rather than a floor.



YOUR CAMPUS MANAGER

The senior member of staff accountable for the whole site and the wellbeing of every participant. They coordinate tutors, mentors and guest speakers, oversee welfare and safeguarding, and are your family's named point of contact while you are with us.

THE EXCELLENCE AWARD

At the end of every in-person course, the campus team choose one participant: not the highest mark, but the person who threw themselves into everything and lifted the group with them.

Commuter and accredited experiences.

Your summer school experience can be tailored to suit your needs. You can choose to commute rather than stay overnight, or apply to take your course as an accredited course.

Both options follow the core summer school timetable, with the same sessions and scheduled activities as other participants.

THE COMMUTER EXPERIENCE

A commuter attends each day but does not stay overnight on campus.

You take part in the full summer school academic course and your afternoon social activity before travelling home before the evening meal. While on campus, you remain in our care from sign-in until collection.

- A pre-agreed designated adult drops you off and collects you each day.
- You register with your mentor on arrival each morning and sign out with a member of staff before you're collected.
- You'll take part in all academic sessions and afternoon activities.
- Breakfast and dinner are not included for commuting participants.
- If you're attending a 13-15 course, lunch is included.

THE ACCREDITED EXPERIENCE

The accredited course is an optional route where your work is formally assessed, so you finish with a qualification worth 8 UK UCAS points or 3 US college credits.

In addition to the standard experience, you complete a small amount of additional teaching and independent written work as part of your assessment.

Before your summer school

You'll receive some pre-course work and information covering the accredited assignment and assessment requirements.

During your experience

You'll have assigned study blocks throughout the two weeks for workbook tasks and research, plus guided sessions covering your key assignment and submission requirements.

After your course ends

You'll complete and submit your workbook and final assignments independently after the course ends.

These two options are independent of each other. You can choose to commute, take the accredited course, or do both. Please note: experiences communicated on this page are in development and subject to change.

Thitinai studied Business Management in Singapore, then Engineering in Tokyo, three weeks apart.

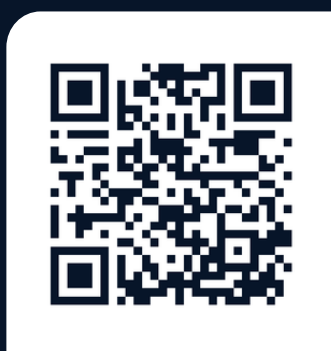
