


## **Installation Instructions**


## Window Framing 72 x 36 and Smaller

- 1) The framing should be at least 14 gage 3" x 1" steel tubing all the way around the window opening.
- 2) The frame opening for the window should be the same size as the call size of the door. (i.e. 72 x 36 call size should have a 72" x 36" opening.)
- 3) Make sure that the window fits flush against the trailer.
- 4) Grind down the original screws in the hinge so that the door will fit flush against the frame. Mount the door to frame using #10 x 3/4" self-tapping sheet metal screws in outer frame as shown in picture A.



## Window Framing 72 x 48 and Larger

- 1) The framing should be a minimum 14 gage, 3" x 2" steel tubing all the way around the window opening.
- 2) The opening for the window should be the same size as the call size of the door. (i.e. 72 x 48 call size should have a 72" x 48" opening.)
- 3) Make sure that the window fits flush against the trailer.
- 4) Grind down the screws in the hinge so that the door will fit flush against the frame. Mount the door to frame using #10 x 3/4" self tapping sheet metal screws in outer frame as shown in picture A.



## Mounting Concession Door

- 1) Once the door is installed into the opening, you will need to install the frame mounting screws every 8 to 10 inches.
- 2) Once the door frame is screwed to the trailer, put screws in-between the existing screws on the hinge. Hinge screws should be approximately 6 inches apart.
- 3) Remove and replace the original Elixir screws that you ground down flush before installing the door into the trailer. Replace original screws with #10 x 3/4" self-tapping screws driving them securely into metal frame and be careful not to strip out screws. All hinge screws must be securely fastened to the 14 gauge, 3" metal frame.
