



THE LORD HEARS THE CRY OF OUR HEARTS


The unknown composer of the O Antiphons hid the crowning touch of his contemplation in the Latin phrase: ERO CRAS. Meditating on the Messianic titles of Jesus in the Prophet Isaiah filled him with increasing desire, even awe. Each antiphon is meant to open our eyes to Jesus as the one foretold by the prophets. Each reveals God's heavenly power come to earth. Each new revelation fills us with hope and thus inspires us to plead with Jesus to work powerfully in our lives, 'Jesus to come and teach us the way to salvation.' or Jesus: 'stretch out your mighty hand to set us free.'

Repeatedly we cry out, "O Come, O Come!" Creating an ever-increasing wave of desire followed by increasing waves of expectation. The Messianic promise contained in each title stirs a deeper desire and longing in our hearts for the Christ to be with us.

On December 24th, using his contemplative and poetic genius, the author reveals the Lord's answer to the plea of every O Antiphon. Read in reverse order the first letter of each title for Christ, beginning with Sapientia and ending with Emmanuel, forms the acrostic Latin phrase, Ero cras 'tomorrow, I will be.' We have cried, "O Come" and now Christ answers, "on Christmas Day, 'I will be' your Wisdom, Lord, Savior, Liberator, Light, King and Emmanuel."



STILL SAINT DOMINICAN'S FAMILY

In 1219 Saint Dominic, entrusted his brother Blessed Mannes de Guzman with the care of the first Dominican Nuns in Madrid founded in 1206. In turn each new Master of the Order appoints a Promoter General of the Nuns. Appointed, in 2020 to a six-year term, Father Fernando García Fernández, OP was mandated our Master General to make visitation to the 180 monasteries approximately 2,500 to 3,000 cloistered nuns on five continents. Originally from Mexico, Father is not completely fluent in English. However, being one with the Nuns in the spirit of St. Dominic, his joy and compassion allowed us to communicate freely.

Father even wore a party apron.

Father shared a photo presentation of his visits to Monasteries in Europe, Asia, North and South America, for example: Ecuador, Spain, Poland, Italy, Japan, Korea, Portugal, Vietnam or the Philippines, allowing us to experience the true meaning of our Order as "the Dominican Family."
