Stories of impact: JOIN Israel's Our Own Way initiative... community building & resilience in Sderot

JOIN Israel's Our Own Way initiative (OOW), based in the city of Sderot, began as an innovative at-risk youth program and has burgeoned into a community-wide supportive network for a full array of vulnerable populations. OOW identifies at-risk youth, elderly, single mothers, new immigrants, and impoverished living in subsidized housing, enlists lay-leaders, and introduces support groups. Group participants are encouraged to formulate ideas to improve their communities.

OOW acts as a forum in which pressing issues and concerns of these groups are brought to the fore, and then works together with the Municipality to address them. Knowing that there's someone that represents them and communicates their needs to the city is assuring and empowering for these communities.

As Pnina Meyerowitz, director of the program, explained:

"Our big thing is building a sense of community belonging, and community resilience. Everyone has something to give and everyone can be a pillar and a strong part of the community."

Situated on the border with Gaza, Sderot is subject to the most bombing out of any city in Israel. In response, the program created a network of "building activists" among volunteers, who are trained to offer support in their building when Sderot is under attack. The building activists receive training in first aid and leadership skills to identify when someone is in distress and needs more serious attention.

Sunset Benefit: A Night of Unity on Yom Ha'atzmaut

More than 125 philanthropists from the Tri-State area came together Tuesday, May 14th for JOIN Israel's Sunset Benefit celebrating Yom Ha'atzmaut, gathering for A Night of Unity to support terror victims in Israel following October 7th.

The funds raised by the event will go towards the organization's Emergency Campaign to provide resources for Southern Israelis in need. Anna and Jonathan Knoll hosted the event.

The event was held at Elsie Rooftop, and featured keynote speaker Shai Davidai, Assistant Professor at

Columbia Business School, who gained notoriety for bringing attention to the school's failure to address rampant antisemitism on campus following the October 7th terrorist attacks.

The headliner was stand-up comedian Talia Reese, who has been featured on talk shows, Sirius XM, and in publications such as The Wall Street Journal and The Jerusalem Post. Shahar Regev, Israeli singer and cellist, did a special performance of Hatikva.

The fundraiser featured a silent art auction, with exquisite art created by Israeli and Jewish artists.
