Cities Leading the Circular Shift

Urban areas generate the majority of global waste but are also the spaces where innovative solutions, community engagement, and regulatory frameworks can be tested and scaled. From local bans and deposit systems to city-wide reuse infrastructures, municipalities are proving that ambitious action at the city level can shape national and even global agendas.

It will examine the practical tools, political will, and partnerships required to make zero-waste a reality in diverse urban contexts, from megacities to smaller municipalities.

- What role do partnerships with communities, businesses, and innovators play in delivering
