About the child/children: G4 is a creative and active child with a love for painting, occasional drawing, scooting, practising on her bike, swimming, climbing, and soft toys. These interests reflect her vibrant personality and blend of creativity, energy, and a need for comfort and imaginative play. She thrives when engaging in activities that challenge her mind and body, while also valuing routines that provide emotional and physical balance.

The ideal Sennie for this role will not only nurture G4's current interests but also actively support her ongoing development and overall well-being. This includes engaging her in exercises designed to enhance motor skills, coordination, and physical strength, as well as maintaining her strict GAPS diet by assisting with food preparation and related tasks. An interest in child-led development, fostering child-based thinking would be an advantage. The ideal Sennie will be asked to undergo 'Floortime' training (at the family's cost) and take an active role in using the learnings in interactions with G4. They will also focus on key growth areas, such as improving G4's focus, fostering emotional regulation, and building her self-confidence. By establishing a structured yet engaging environment, the Sennie will ensure activities are enjoyable, meaningful, and tailored to G4's unique needs. This role requires a patient, proactive, and compassionate individual who is dedicated to supporting G4's progress and well-being in all areas of her life. A playful personality with willingness to interact and engage with G4 and an interest in early intervention are needed. ABA or compliance-based approaches are not suitable for G4.

Who would suit this role:

- Experience working with children under five, particularly those with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and non-verbal communication needs.
- Demonstrates kindness, compassion, and a genuine passion for supporting G4's growth and well-being.
- Patient and empathetic, with a proactive approach to understanding and addressing G4's unique needs.
- Skilled in supporting non-verbal communication through methods such as visual aids, sign language, or alternative communication techniques.
- Willing and able to implement exercises and treatments as guided by professionals, particularly 'Floortime' to support physical and developmental progress.
- Knowledge of or willingness to learn about special dietary requirements, including meal planning and preparation.
- Ensures mealtime is a positive and engaging experience for G4.
- Capable of fostering a nurturing and stimulating environment that promotes learning, social interaction, and enjoyment.
- Sensitive to G4's individual pace and preferences during activities.
- Strong ability to collaborate effectively with parents and other professionals involved in the child's care.
