The First Global Challenge is the world's biggest robotics competition which brings students from over 180 countries worldwide to participate in the STEM challenge. The diverse community of students offers opportunities for nurturing cross-cultural communication and cooperation while sharing good practices.

Mr. Aaron M Jabbie, a senior Teacher and Chemistry/ Science Teacher at Marina International School, is the pioneer of the robotics club at Marina International School. He is committed to helping students rise to their highest potential. He is also the coordinator of the Science Fair at the School. Character/costume parade


Class visit to Timbooktoo Fair

Communication is pivotal in the growth and development of students. Therefore, we inspire our students to love reading for fun and to expand their comprehension and communication skills.



WhatsApp

WhatsApp You must be at least 16 years old to register for and use WhatsApp. WhatsApp is a free messaging app that allows you to send messages and videos.

Group chats: One of the key features is that WhatsApp has a group chat function that is set up by one person (the admin). Everybody in the group, even if they are not one of your child's phone contacts, will be able to see all messages within that group.

If your child is added to a group with someone that they have previously blocked, that person can still see their messages and send them messages within the group. In settings, you can change who can add your child to groups, for example, you can change it to 'my contacts', which means that only those in your child's contacts can add them to a group. You can leave a group chat at any point so talk to your child and encourage them to leave any chat that makes them feel uncomfortable.

Location sharing: If switched on, then when you share images/videos, it will show the location of where they were taken. This can be switched off in your phone settings. There is also a Live Location feature which allows you to share your location. Talk to your child about when this would be appropriate to use but also the potential danger of sharing their location, for example with strangers.

Blocking/Reporting: Show your child how to block and report.

Online Bullying: WhatsApp has been used in instances of online bullying, e.g. to send nasty messages or share images of other children without their permission. It is important to have regular chats with your child about their online life and that they understand that they must talk to you or another trusted adult if they are being bullied. What to do first (Step 1):

Most of our parental/student concerns can be resolved by speaking with your child's teacher. The teacher will make every effort to resolve the concern informally. We must understand your concern and support your child in a safe and caring environment. **Your first contact should always be your child's teacher if you have academic or social concerns.** Please email or contact your teacher with your concern. Your teacher may require meeting you as they work through your concerns. Our experience is your teacher will have the tools and strategies to support your child. **Your teacher will always be your first point of contact.**

What to do next (Step 2):

If the concerns are not improving and you are not satisfied with the teacher's response or direction, we recommend contacting the teacher again and informing our Head of Pastoral through email (c.c)(High School: highschooldeputypastoral@mis.edu.gm OR Junior School: juniorschooldeputypastoral@mis.edu.gm or phone call. The teacher or a member of the administrative team will contact you to arrange a meeting to discuss your concerns. This will provide all parties with an opportunity to understand the concerns, review ongoing strategies, and provide additional strategies to bring your concerns to a resolution. You may have another family member or friend with you during all meetings with our school.

What to do next if still concerned (Step 3):

If the concern continues after interventions from the teacher and Heads of School, please contact the Director (director@mis.edu.gm). The Director will require a meeting to discuss your ongoing concerns. You may have another family member or friend with you during all meetings with our school, and a translator will be provided for those that require it. The Director may request other educators (Heads, Classroom Teacher, etc.) as required to support the concerns of the family and child during any meeting.

A collaborative restorative justice approach will always be our guide. Conversations will always be respectful and caring, with the child's best interest as our guide. We will continue to recommend changes where required. Our goal is for your child to feel safe in a supportive environment where they can learn to their potential.


