Transforming 9th Grade Through Transitions, Relationships, and Grading

By applying CORE's cross-district insights and embedded coaching, Garden Grove USD strengthened crucial entry-year supports, set up collaborative teacher teams, and redesigned grading and scheduling. The result was a smoother start to high school and improved student outcomes.



Garden Grove USD: Recognizing 9th grade as the Make-or-Break Moment

When Garden Grove began its Break Through Success Community journey, nearly 4 in 10 freshmen were off track for graduation—with rates as high as 56% at some schools. While many districts focused on supporting juniors and seniors, Garden Grove took a different approach. Leaders followed the research: getting students on track early is the strongest predictor of future success.

Opportunity

Garden Grove Unified saw an urgent opportunity to reduce the number of offtrack 9th graders by embedding a proactive, systemwide approach that aligned district and site-level strategies from day one.

Insight

District leaders recognized that sustainable change would require teacher buy-in, collaborative leadership, and a shared understanding of what drives student success in 9th grade. Building strong relationships and equitable grading practices would be essential.

Intervention

District administered a Summer Bridge program, supported teacher teams, and embedded CORE coaches to guide adult teaming, grading equity, scheduling improvements, and relationships.

Impact

85% of high school freshmen can name an adult they can go to for support in school. More students than ever will complete their freshmen year on-track for success after high school, and there will be fewer Ds and Fs on freshmen transcripts and higher freshmen GPAs across all high schools.
