# Reducing Off-Track Rates Through Alignment and Consistency

Castlemont High School in Oakland Unified transformed its 9th grade experience by fostering a culture of trust among adults, establishing common routines, and ensuring vulnerable students feel seen and believed in.



## Castlemont High School: Making Student-Centered Care Systematic

When Castlemont High School joined the Breakthrough Success Community, there were few common practices among 9<sup>th</sup> grade teachers and differing opinions on how to best support students. Their challenges were intensified by the realities of serving a historically disinvested yet resilient East Oakland community with large populations of Black and newcomer students.

#### Opportunity

Castlemont High School had a deep culture of care for students, but they recognized a need to operationalize that care into defined structures and routines the team could use to systematically support the students that need it most.

#### Insight

Operationalizing care required examining data and discussing the details of practice in new ways. Guided by the leadership of Assistant Principal Samantha Odom, the team built trust and a shared purpose around student success, enabling them to use grades, attendance, and survey data to identify strategic segments of students to intervene with using common approaches.

#### Intervention

Among other changes, Castlemont implemented a protocol to structure teacher conversations about student needs; standardized a cadence of Gradebook Reviews and Make-Up Days each marking period; and built relationships specifically with students who reported no connections to adults at school.

#### Impact

Castlemont has produced the most significant improvements of the five OUSD comprehensive high schools participating in the network. Approximately 200  $9^{th}$  graders enter Castlemont each year, and the school's focus on  $9^{th}$  grade success has changed hundreds of life trajectories... and counting!
