The majority of Mark's work is in road traffic litigation, including credit hire, low velocity impact, late notification, and fraudulent claims. He has an impressive success rate in defending such claims at trial, including securing findings of fundamental dishonesty on behalf of insurers.

Alongside road traffic cases, Mark also handles employers' liability, public liability, and highway authority claims. He is recognised as an expert in quantum disputes, costs arguments, and procedural issues arising from the RTA and EL/PL Protocols. He provides seminars and training to solicitors and claims handlers on substantive and procedural personal injury law.

In addition to advocacy, Mark undertakes advisory and drafting work across all areas of personal injury litigation, with paperwork typically turned around within 14 days or sooner if required.

Beyond personal injury, Mark has experience in costs hearings, anti-social behaviour injunctions, committal proceedings, and commercial matters such as contractual disputes, sale of goods, debt recovery, possession, and insolvency proceedings. His judicial roles have further broadened his expertise across these areas.
