Non-Adaptive Tests

1) Timer

Your child will see how much time is left in the test in the top right of their screen.

Multiple-choice questions

Most questions are multiple-choice. Your child will need to click on the answer(s) they think are correct. The answer option(s) turn green when selected.

Next buttor

Your child will need to click the 'Next' button when they are ready to move on to the next question.

A Non-adaptive tests: 'Back' button


In non-adaptive tests, all children see the same questions in the same order. Your child will see a 'Back' button for these tests indicating that they can go back to previous questions if they would like to check their answers.

5 Scroll down

For English comprehension questions, your child will see a label indicating they need to scroll down to read the full text.

Question selector

In non-adaptive tests, your child will see which question number they are on at the bottom of their screen. They can click on the arrow to skip forward or go back to a specific question number.



Adaptive Tests

1) No 'back' button

In adaptive tests, the questions adapt to your child's performance. If they are answering questions correctly, they become more challenging, while if they are answering questions incorrectly, they get a little easier. There is no back button in these tests, so your child will not be able to return to a previous answer.

Question selector

In adaptive tests, your child will see which question number they are on at the top of their screen.

Free response questions

For some questions, your child will need to write their answer. They will need to use their keyboard to type the answer in the box provided on the screen.

4) Finish

When your child reaches the final question, the button in the bottom of their screen will say 'Finish' instead of 'Next'. Clicking this button will end the test.
