Sample questions


In this document you will find some sample questions for a Verbal Reasoning Quest assessment. These are designed to help you understand what the questions in your exam might look like and how to approach them. These questions will not appear in your real assessment.

Each school's assessment will be slightly different, but these examples will help you become familiar with the types of questions you could see.

Answer sheet
