Details

Reporting to the VP of Environment and Permitting and supporting the Environmental Coordinator, you will be responsible for monitoring, collecting and organizing environmental data, including waste, water and reclamation data. Duties also include spill recording and reporting, and water testing alongside environmental site inspections and audits.

Location: Remote field camp, east-central Yukon – 50-person camp.

Schedule: Rotational – exact schedule TBD, from mid-May to late September.

Experience & Key Skills

- Minimum 2 years experience in environmental monitoring, or 3-5 years in the mineral exploration or mining industry in a closely related role.
- Diploma/Undergraduate Degree in Environmental Science/Biology is desirable.
- A positive attitude and strong organizational skills.
- Must be comfortable working in an isolated, remote camp of up to 50 people.
- Thorough understanding of relevant health and safety regulations.
- Competency with Microsoft Office software suite, and proficient English reading, writing, and verbal skills.
- Competency with GIS software such as Esri ArcGIS Pro.
- Eligibility to work in Canada.

Key Tasks

Compliance

- Ensure all activities are compliant with and adhere to Snowline's best management practices.



- Ensure that all activities are compliant with and adhere to permit and regulatory requirements.
- Implement a cadence of regular audits, site, and activity inspections to maintain compliance with relevant permits and regulations. Ensure that all inspections are well documented and that an action item register is kept.
- Implement controls to mitigate potential environmental hazards or noncompliance.
- Oversee the implementation and ensure compliance with Snowline's Wildlife Protection Plan.
- Report Environmental incidents when required.
- Ensure that permits are displayed prominently and there is easy access to permits and reference documents.

Environmental Monitoring & Data Collection

- Collaborate with the Environmental team and contractors to maintain the seasonal environmental database.
- Monitor environmental performance.
- Manage and promote the recording and collection of project Wildlife observations and ensure that records are kept up to date.
- Coordinate site visits with seasonal contractors.

Progressive Reclamation

- Plan, carry out and keep accurate records of progressive reclamation activities during seasonal field programs, including reclamation of drill pads and helicopter pads.
