JUDGES 1:1-2:5

"But you have not obeyed my voice. What is this you have done?" (Judges 2:2, ESV)

Review the Sermon

Read Judges 1:1-2:5.

How does the book of Judges begin to show things “going south” for Israel?

How did the illustration of buried landmines help explain Israel’s problem with the Canaanites and idolatry?

Why is half-way discipleship not actual discipleship? (Judges 2:1-5 should help)

Assess your Life

Where do you most often feel tempted to say, “it’s good enough” in your walk with Christ?

Where might you be choosing the easy road rather than trusting God with the harder path?

In your pursuit of holiness, do you resonate more with “I can handle it” (over-confidence) or “I can’t help it” (paralysis) right now? Why?



Apply the Truth

What next step can you take toward whole-hearted discipleship?

Is there a buried idol that God is calling you to dig up and destroy? How can you identify and destroy it?

How can this small group be more intentional about encouraging whole-hearted discipleship in each other?

Commit this Week

Will you commit to identifying your idols, destroying them (and your trust in them), and following Jesus with your whole heart?
