Re: Pneumococcal Vaccination and Removal of Focused Infection Control Surveys

As you may already be aware, on October 26, 2024, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has updated its recommendations for the pneumococcal vaccine (Pneumococcal Vaccine Recommendations). The recommendations are as follows:

Pneumococcal vaccination for adults 50 years and older (age recommendation was previously 65 years and older).

Facilities are required to offer PNA vaccines to residents and staff age 50 and older as outlined by regulations CMS F883 and NYS PHL, Article 21A.

Adults ≥50 years old Complete pneumococcal vaccine schedules

Prior vaccines	Option A	Option B
None*	PGV20 or PGV21	PCV15 ≥1 year¹ PPSV23¹
PCV15 only at any age	≥1 year [†] PPSV23¹	NO OPTION B
PCV15 & PPSV23 OR PCV20 OR PCV21 at any age	No vaccines recommended; schedule is complete.	
PPSV23 only at any age	≥1 year PCV20 or PCV21	≥1 year PCV15
PCV13 only at any age	≥1 year PCV20 or PCV21	NO OPTION B
PCV13 at any age & PPSV23 at <65 yrs	≥5 years PCV20 or PCV21	

Also applies to people who received PCV7 at any age and no other pneumococcal vaccines If PPSV23 is not available, PCV20 or PCV21 may be used Consider minimum interval (8 weeks) for adults with an immunocompromising condition, cochlear implant, or cerebrospinal fluid leak (CSF) leak For adults with an immunocompromising condition, cochlear implant, or CSF leak, the minimum interval for PPSV23 is ≥8 weeks since last PCV13 dose and ≥5 years since last PCV13 dose

Additionally, CMS OSO-23-25-ALL, revised 7/30/2025 highlights that focused infection control surveys are no longer a part of the standard survey process and that any Covid-19 or infection control concerns should be conducted through complaint investigations outside of the LTCSP process.
