Re: Point of Care Antigen Testing for SARs-COV-2 Infection

Please be advised that NYSDOH has released guidance regarding Point of Care (POC) Antigen Testing for SARs-COV-2 infection. Please review the attached newly released guidance and FAQs. See pages 7-10 for specifics relating to Skilled Nursing Facilities. Highlights include:

- Facilities <u>can</u> use POC Antigen testing for residents, staff, and visitors in accordance with federal approval outlined in CMS 20-38. There are specific instances where confirmatory PCR testing is necessary outlined below and detailed in the algorithm by NYSDOH that is in alignment with CDC guidance.
- All results are reportable to the NYS ECLRS system and facilities require CLIA approval. Pursuant to the current Executive Order 202.61 results must be reported within 3 hours.
- Contact tracing should be initiated for confirmed positive SARs-COV-2 infections.
- Outbreak response is triggered by 1 nursing home onset SARS-COV-2 infection Staff Member or Resident.
- The need to differentiate symptomatic residents and asymptomatic residents and the testing requirements and need for PCR follow up test if indicated.
- Early identification and implementation of symptomatic residents initiating Transmission Based Precautions pending test results.
- Refer to the Nursing Home and Adult Care Facilities Algorithm.
