2009 to 2015

The founding directors, Marlon, David, and Jamie, all knew each other from their time working at Jenners Department Store. In 2009, they seized an opportunity to purchase a client list from a one-person IT company. Thus, on September 1st, 2009, Dunedin IT Limited was formed.

The iPhone 3 had only a 3-megapixel camera compared to today's 48 megapixels. Cyber attacks were on the rise, leading to the introduction of Cyber Essentials. Microsoft made a classic U-turn decision with Windows 8 initially removed the taskbar, anticipating a future dominated by touchscreen devices, but reintroduced it a year later due to user demand.

2015 to 2020

In 2017, Dunedin IT expanded its services by becoming a wholesale provider of telecoms with the addition of Rory as Director. This period also saw the opening of the Northumberland office and the introduction of advanced cybersecurity services, such as enhanced email security and security awareness programs, reflecting the growing importance of cybersecurity in the business. Dunedin IT hired its first Glasgow engineer and opening a Glasgow office, renting its first data centre rack, and expanding the Edinburgh office. The company achieved ISO 9001 accreditation and celebrated its 10th anniversary in 2019. Additionally, a dedicated helpdesk manager was appointed, and Cyber Essentials certification was maintained.

2020 to 2025


