NNDA Brings Investment and High-Wage Jobs to Northern Nevada

CARSON CITY, Nev. – Northern Nevada continues to strengthen its reputation as a premier destination for business investment, as two companies have announced plans to establish new operations in the region. Approved during February 5th, 2026, Nevada Governor’s Office of Economic Development (GOED) Board meeting, the projects represent more than \$312 million in new capital investment and will create nearly 57 new jobs across Northern Nevada.

Comstock Metals, LLC will establish a state-of-the-art solar panel recycling facility in Lyon County. A full-service solar recycler, Comstock Metals, LLC has set the industry standard for solar panel recycling through advanced, modern technologies and material recovery processes. The company’s operations align closely with Nevada’s clean energy goals and innovative economy.

Comstock Metals, LLC. was approved for tax abatements and is expected to create 43 jobs within the first two years of operation, with an average hourly wage of \$41.51. The company plans to invest \$11.7 million in capital equipment during its first two years in Northern Nevada.

SV RNO Property Owner 1, LLC plans to establish a large-scale data center operation in Storey County. The company designs and operates mega-scale, single- and multi-user data center campuses across the United States to meet growing demand for artificial intelligence and cloud computing infrastructure.

The project was approved for 10-year Data Center tax abatements and is expected to create 14 jobs within five years, offering an average hourly wage of \$54.29. first five years of operation and generating approximately \$45.7 million in new tax revenue over the next decade.

Together, these projects underscore Northern Nevada’s leadership in innovation, sustainability, and economic diversification. With strategic infrastructure, a highly skilled workforce, and strong regional collaboration, Northern Nevada continues to stand out as a top destination for companies looking to grow and invest in the American West.
