

Acceptable Use Policy

What changed in v2.0. The Prohibited Uses list (§3) now expressly prohibits credential sharing, User Cap circumvention, and any use that bypasses authentication or usage-measurement controls, aligning with EULA v2.0 §5. All other behavioural and ethical use prohibitions are substantively unchanged.

1. Purpose

This Acceptable Use Policy (**AUP**) defines acceptable and prohibited uses of the AI Uniti software services (the **Software**). It supplements and is incorporated by reference into the End User License Agreement v2.0, the Online Purchase & Subscription Agreement v2.0, and any Order Form.

2. Permitted Use

The Customer and its Named Users may use the Software only for lawful business purposes in accordance with applicable laws, the EULA v2.0, and this Policy. Use of the Software is limited to the Named Users authorised under the Customer's User Cap.

3. Prohibited Uses

The Customer and its Named Users must not use the Software, AI Output, or AI Uniti credentials to:

- impersonate individuals or organisations;
- conduct scams, fraud or deception;
- generate or amplify misinformation, disinformation or coordinated inauthentic behaviour against any party;
- violate privacy or surveillance laws, or any applicable consumer protection laws;
- provide legal, medical or financial advice without appropriate professional qualification;
- harass, discriminate against, or exploit individuals or groups;
- train competing AI systems, models or detection methodologies using the Software, AI Output, or AI Uniti's prompts and workflows;
- **share, sell, sublicense, rent or otherwise transfer access credentials to any individual who is not a designated Named User of the Customer (new in v2.0);**
- **permit more individuals to access the Software than the current User Cap permits, whether concurrently or sequentially through credential rotation (new in v2.0);**
- **circumvent, bypass or attempt to disable any access control, authentication, rate limit or usage measurement mechanism implemented by AI Uniti (new in v2.0);**
- reverse engineer, decompile or extract AI models, prompts, agents, workflows, orchestration logic or analytics methodologies;
- build competing products using the Software or AI Output.

4. Named User Responsibility

The Customer is responsible for the acts and omissions of its Named Users as if they were its own. The Customer must communicate this Policy to each Named User and ensure that each Named User is subject to written confidentiality obligations no less protective than the EULA v2.0.

5. Reporting Concerns

If a Named User becomes aware of any use of the Software that may breach this Policy, the Customer must report it to AI Uniti at sales@aiuniti.com. AI Uniti also welcomes reports under its Whistleblower Policy where appropriate.

6. Enforcement

AI Uniti may suspend or terminate access immediately for breach of this Policy, including for credential sharing, User Cap circumvention, or any other violation that creates legal, security or regulatory risk. Termination for breach does not entitle the Customer to a refund, except as required by applicable law.

7. Updates

AI Uniti may update this Policy from time to time. The current version is published at aiuniti.com/legal. Material changes take effect at the next renewal unless otherwise required by law.
