How often do you use Deaf interpreters?



Where do you use Auslan interpreters?



Where do you use Deaf interpreters?




Can you access Auslan interpreters when you need them?

679 responses from 846 people




How far in advance do you usually need to book an Auslan interpreter?

656 responses from 846 people




Can you access Deaf interpreters when you need them?
