Our parish is dedicated to creating a safe, respectful, and welcoming environment for all, especially children and vulnerable adults.


Zero Tolerance for Abuse



Third Week of Advent: Joy

Friends, we've lit the candles of hope and peace. Now, as we enter the third week of Advent, the theme shifts to **Joy**, often called Gaudete Sunday (Rejoice Sunday). This is the Sunday of gladness, as we



realize Christmas is drawing near. We light the third candle, the pink one, to symbolize this rising joy, a joy that comes from God, not worldly things, the same joy Mary felt, the same gladness of the angels. This week, we anticipate the fulfillment of God's promises as we prepare for Jesus' arrival.

Let us pray: Gracious God, as we light the third candle of joy, fill our hearts with gladness. May we share this joy and hope with all people, especially those in need, as we await the coming of Jesus. Amen.

ORIGINS of the CHRISTMAS CRIB

St. Francis spent the Christmas of 1223 at Grecchio in the valley of Rieti, Italy where he formulated the idea of building a crib. He said: "I would like to make a memorial of the Child Jesus who was born at Bethlehem and in some way behold with bodily eyes the hardships of His infant state, lying on hay in a manger with the ox and ass standing by."

Accordingly a "crib" was set up at the hermitage, and the peasants crowded into Midnight Mass, at which St.

Francis served as Deacon and preached on the mystery of Christmas. From this time on the custom of crib-making to express the Christian sentiments of Bethlehem grew in popularity.
