'Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.'

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.'

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him. Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.

Brother Maximilian Mary Streher was born 22nd March, 1990 in Penrith. He was baptized on 6 May 1990 and confirmed on 20 May 1998 at Saint Nicholas of Myra Catholic Church, Penrith.

Brother Maximilian completed university studies in a Bachelor of Business and Commerce at Western Syd-

ney University, and worked in Catholic media for 6 years. He joined the Immaculata Community as a lay member in 2012 until 2018 when he then joined as a Brother postulant. Brother Maximilian made his first profession on 11th February, 2021, and made his perpetual profession on 8th December, 2025. As a Brother of the Immaculata Community, he serves the Church with the Brothers and Sisters in the work of Spiritual Renewal through Eucharistic Adoration and faith formation in parishes and mission.

Brother Maximilian completed a Master of Arts – Philosophical studies in 2016, and has recently completed a Bachelor of Philosophy/Bachelor of Theology through the University of Notre Dame Australia.

His pastoral formation with the Immaculata community has included ministry to youth, street outreach, parish missions and parish retreats and assisting in serving at the Cathedral. He is currently undertaking Clinical Pastoral Education course at St Agnes' Lifestyle and Care Village, Port Macquarie.

He was instituted as an Acolyte on 17th December 2017, and a Lector on the 19th July 2025. He was admitted as a Candidate for Holy Orders on 1st November 2025.



Allem James Dalisay Alba was born on 29 August 1995 in Malolos, Bulacan, Philippines. He was baptised on 10 September 1995 and confirmed on 22 February 2004 at the Parish Church of St James the Apostle, Plaridel.

He entered the Immaculate Conception Major Seminary in 2011, completing a Bachelor of

Philosophy in 2016, and continued his formation until 2021. His pastoral formation included ministry to youth, the abandoned elderly, and persons with psychological disabilities, with exposure to rural, coastal (island) parishes, as well as radio ministry and hospital chaplaincy training. In 2017, He taught philosophy and Christian Education at a secondary level. He was instituted as a Lector in 2019, made his perpetual profession as a Third Order Carmelite of the Ancient Observance (O.Carm) in 2020, and was instituted as an Acolyte in the same year.

He was received into the Diocese of Armidale in 2022 and arrived in Australia in 2023. While undertaking formation at the Seminary of the Good Shepherd, Homebush, and studies at the Catholic Institute of Sydney, he completed pastoral training in Australia through parish placements within the Diocese of Armidale, Sydney Catholic Schools and SRE teaching, as well as chaplaincy exposure at the University of Sydney , and charitable ministry with the Missionaries of Charity. He completed his studies in 2025 and is to be conferred the Bachelor of Divinity in February 2026.

He was admitted as a Candidate for Holy Orders on 21 November 2025.
