

Wildlife Veterinary Course, Limpopo, South Africa



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Wildlife Veterinary Course offers a **two-to-four-week program** designed for **vets**, **students**, **and nurses** where you are exposed to the reality of the **life of a wildlife veterinarian** in South Africa.

You will accompany a veterinarian on his/her workday, get exposed to the capture and care of a variety of different wildlife species, and obtain handson experience and a diverse understanding of wildlife veterinary medicine and its challenges.

OUR AIM

- Offer a high-quality experience where veterinarians, nurses, and students can gain knowledge and guided practical experience in wildlife veterinary medicine.
- Be exposed to the **reality and difficulties** of wildlife medicine in Africa.
- Concepts that **can only be learned by working with wild animals** in their natural environment and among locals.



SOUTH AFRICA

Our Wildlife experience takes place in **Limpopo**, we are an **ambulatory clinic** that provides services for nature/game reserves throughout South Africa. We also have a **small animal/wildlife clinic** in our facilities.



VETS, STUDENTS AND NURSES

Designed by wildlife veterinarians for vets, students & nurses. The course is given in English, but we also speak French, Spanish, Portuguese and Afrikaans.

PROGRAM CONTENT

Due to the **unpredictable nature of the wildlife work**, during your time with us, you can be exposed to any of the following:

- Chemical immobilization darting, monitoring, transporting (Ground/Air-Helicopter)
- Hands-on mass game capture
- Translocation and reintroduction
 Legal veterinary protocols
- Treatment and rehabilitation of injured and sick animals
- Disease testing and quarantine
- Pregnancy diagnosis and ultrasound
- Stool sampling and fecal egg counts
- External parasite identification
- Necropsy

The life of a wildlife veterinarian has **no set hours**, so students need to be ready for very early mornings that finish early afternoon or that continue until late evening, call-outs at night, and from time to time work during the weekends.

Arrival/Departure

Students should book their flights so that they arrive on a **Sunday morning** at OR Tambo International Airport and fly out **late Saturday evening**. A shuttle will be waiting for you at arrivals and drive you to the Game reserve (two-hour drive). On the final day, a shuttle to the airport will also be provided.



You will be hosted in a safe and comfortable accommodation surrounded by wildlife. Should the vet have to travel you may sleep in other lodges or tents... however, hot showers and toilets should always be available.

The student house has a big garden with fruit trees and an outside fireplace, a comfortable and cozy living room, a fully equipped kitchen, 3 rooms with two individual beds each and plenty of closet space, 3 bathrooms with 2 showers, a lecture room, a lab and, a small library with veterinary books and books about wildlife.



The accommodation will be furnished with food based on the student's **dietary requirements**, and food will be replaced according to necessity. Students will prepare meals for themselves.



During days off (weekends and public holidays) students can:

Be healthy

- A good physical/mental condition is very important for this type of field work. It will be necessary to make physical efforts and adapt to extreme temperatures.

Medium English level

 The program will be given in English. In the field, you will hear English and Afrikaans. A low level of English will compromise communication and your learning experience.

Open minded

- Be a person with an open mind, desire to learn and enjoy the African experience.
