2. USE THE MOST EFFECTIVE STRUCTURE: PRESENT → PAST → FUTURE

This is the simplest and most professional way to answer the question.

1. Present – Start with Your Current Role

Give a quick introduction to what you do today.

Example:

“I’m currently a Business Analyst with expertise in data reporting, requirement gathering, and cross-functional collaboration.”

2. Past – Highlight Relevant Experience and Achievements

Share 1–2 key accomplishments or responsibilities.

Example:

"In my previous roles, I streamlined reporting processes, supported product teams, and contributed to projects that improved efficiency and accuracy."

3. Future – Connect Your Experience to the Role

Show why you're interested and how you can contribute.

Example:

"I'm now looking for a position where I can deepen my analytical skills and contribute to meaningful projects."

3. TIPS TO DELIVER A STRONG ANSWER

1. Keep It Professional

Focus on your work, skills, and strengths—not personal details.

2. Tailor Your Answer for the Job

Highlight the experience that matches the job description.

3. Keep It Concise and Clear

Aim for around **60–90 seconds**.

4. Use Confident, Positive Language

Speak with clarity and purpose.

5. Practice, But Don't Memorize

Your answer should sound natural, not rehearsed.

6. Support Claims With Examples

If you mention a skill, briefly show how you've used it.

For Freshers

"I recently graduated with a degree in commerce, where I built strong analytical and communication skills. During my internship, I gained experience in data entry and customer coordination. I'm now looking for an opportunity to apply my skills in a professional environment."

For IT Professionals

"I'm a Software Engineer with experience in Java, microservices, and backend systems. In my last role, I improved system performance and collaborated with cross-functional teams. I'm looking for a role where I can work on scalable tech solutions and continue growing my technical skills."

For Recruiters

"I have hands-on experience in end-to-end recruitment, including sourcing, screening, and closing roles across multiple domains. I've worked closely with hiring managers to ensure smooth hiring processes. I'm looking for a position where I can manage high-volume hiring and contribute to recruitment strategy."

- ✗ **Sharing irrelevant personal information**
- ✗ **Sounding unsure or unprepared**
