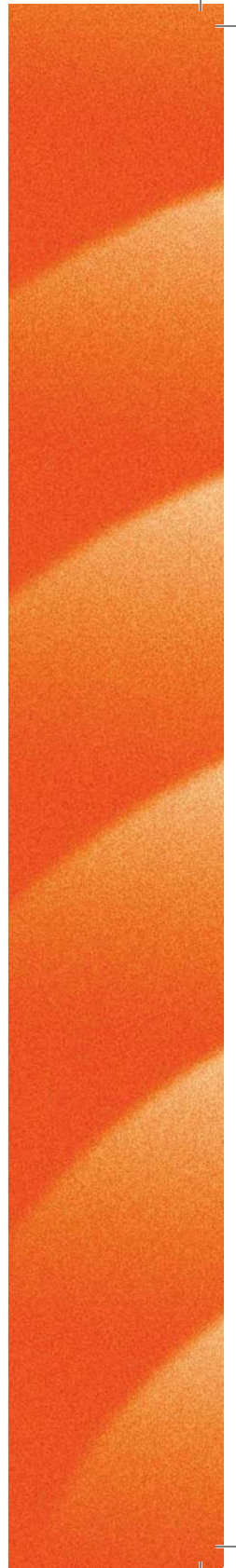


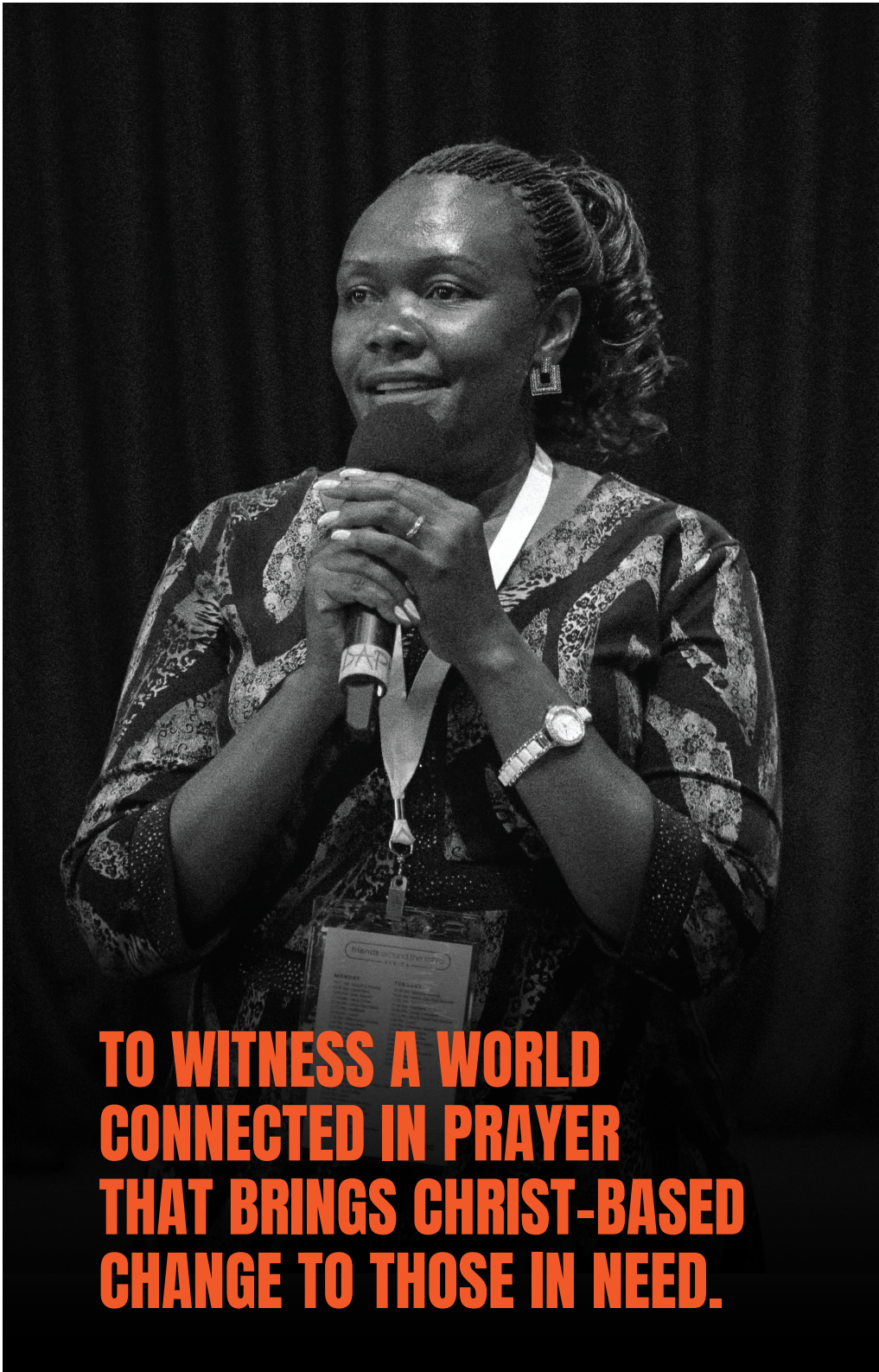

## The World Changers Vision:

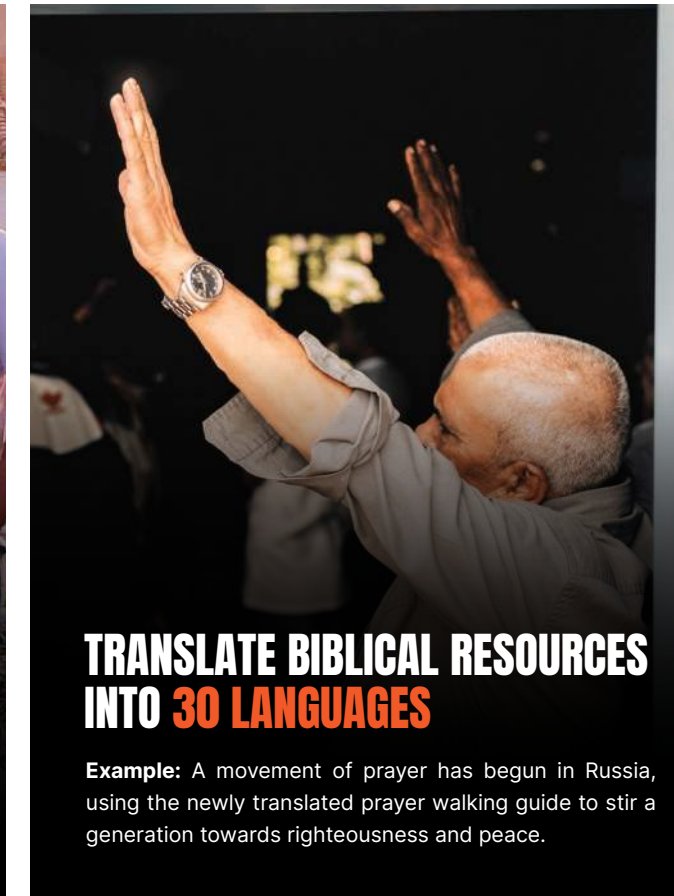
The goal by the end of 2026 is to give \$15,000,000 in order to:

- Bring human, material, and spiritual resources to **50 nations**
- Build **30** sustainable harvest centers



## CULTIVATE PRAYER COMMUNITIES IN 237 NATIONS AND TERRITORIES

**Example:** A new friend from Bolivia attended Friends Around the Table for the first time in August 2025. Since then, he has taken Attack Lambs training to his church and nation through organizing and having a prayer walk for Bolivia, teaching it in his church, and organizing a youth prayer team.



## TRANSLATE BIBLICAL RESOURCES INTO 30 LANGUAGES

**Example:** A movement of prayer has begun in Russia, using the newly translated prayer walking guide to stir a generation towards righteousness and peace.



## FACILITATE PRAYER WALKING TRAINING IN 132 NATIONS

**Example:** Our friends at Grow Mongolia have taken prayer walking trainings into more than 53 cities and villages in 12 nations/regions throughout Asia in 2025.



## BRING HUMAN, SPIRITUAL, AND MATERIAL RESOURCES TO 50 NATIONS

**Example:** During the March 2025 Friends Around the Table Europe/Middle East gathering in Thessaloniki, Greece, new friends there asked about serving families of children living with autism because they saw the need in their community. Two of the leaders for the autism project were attending this gathering. Together, new friends were able to develop a way meet this need through the love of Jesus.



## ESTABLISH 30 SUSTAINABLE HARVEST CENTERS

**Example:** It has been encouraging to see the Harvest Center in Brazil at work. A relationship that began with prayer and grew through Kingdom friendships, led to a God-ordained opportunity for collaboration between SEAPC Brazil and Oral Roberts University. Through this partnership, students served a ministry in Vietnam in 2025 and will now serve in South America under the leadership of SEAPC Brazil and Igreja Bíblica da Paz. Although SEAPC Brazil is still young, faithful prayer and commitment to God's Word are already producing fruit, with spiritual, human, and material resources being mobilized both to and from the nation.

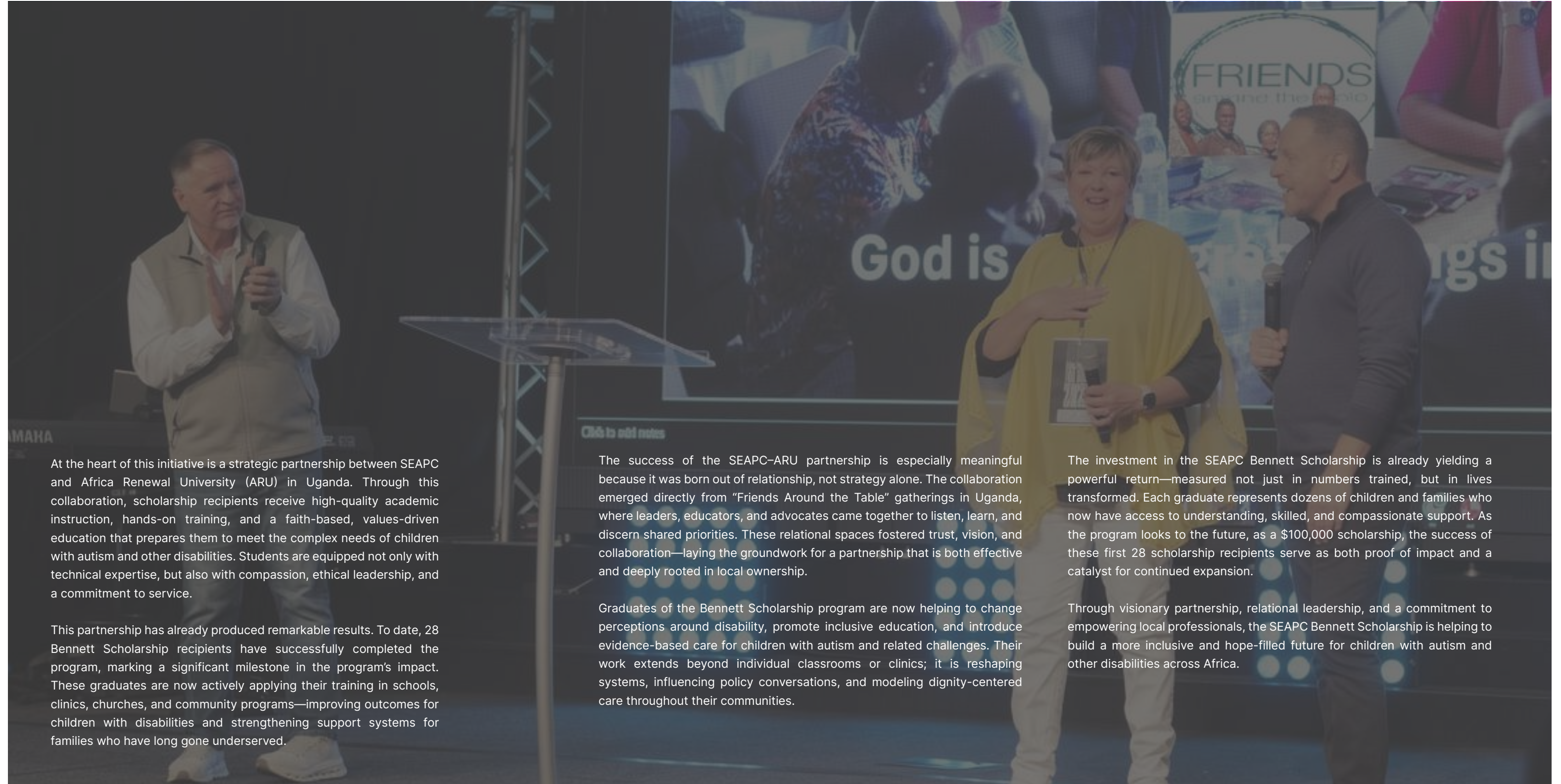


Empowering Care, Transforming Futures:

## THE SEAPC BENNETT SCHOLARSHIP INITIATIVE

Access to quality care and education for children with autism and other developmental disabilities remains limited across much of Africa. A shortage of trained professionals, combined with social stigma and limited resources, has left many children and families without the support they need to thrive. In response to this urgent challenge, the SEAPC Bennett Scholarship was launched—a bold investment designed to equip African professionals with specialized training to serve children with autism and other disabilities across the continent.

The Bennett Scholarship focuses on building sustainable, local capacity by training African workers who understand the cultural, educational, and community contexts in which they serve. Rather than relying on outside intervention, the program empowers leaders from within Africa to become educators, therapists, advocates, and practitioners—bringing long-term impact to families and communities.



At the heart of this initiative is a strategic partnership between SEAPC and Africa Renewal University (ARU) in Uganda. Through this collaboration, scholarship recipients receive high-quality academic instruction, hands-on training, and a faith-based, values-driven education that prepares them to meet the complex needs of children with autism and other disabilities. Students are equipped not only with technical expertise, but also with compassion, ethical leadership, and a commitment to service.

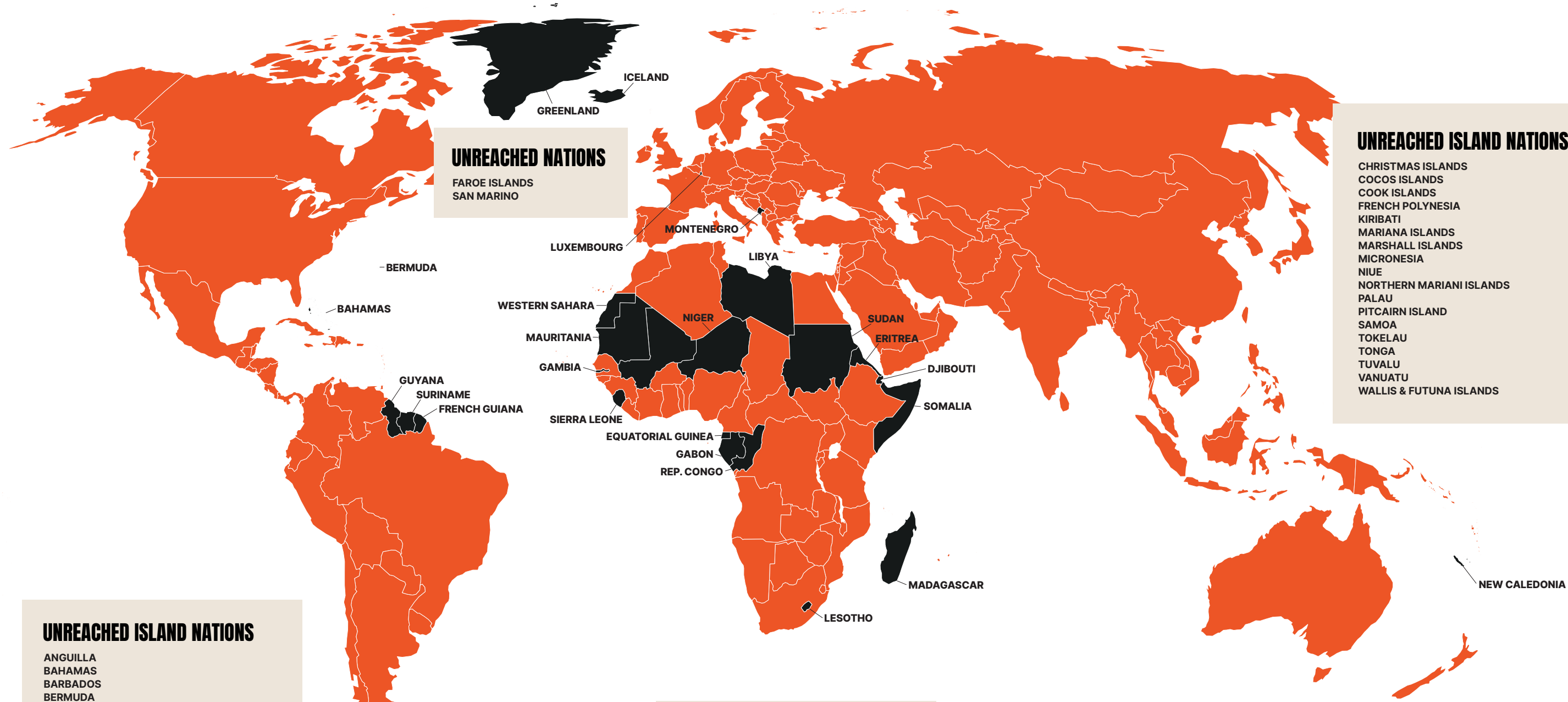
This partnership has already produced remarkable results. To date, 28 Bennett Scholarship recipients have successfully completed the program, marking a significant milestone in the program's impact. These graduates are now actively applying their training in schools, clinics, churches, and community programs—improving outcomes for children with disabilities and strengthening support systems for families who have long gone underserved.

The success of the SEAPC-ARU partnership is especially meaningful because it was born out of relationship, not strategy alone. The collaboration emerged directly from “Friends Around the Table” gatherings in Uganda, where leaders, educators, and advocates came together to listen, learn, and discern shared priorities. These relational spaces fostered trust, vision, and collaboration—laying the groundwork for a partnership that is both effective and deeply rooted in local ownership.

Graduates of the Bennett Scholarship program are now helping to change perceptions around disability, promote inclusive education, and introduce evidence-based care for children with autism and related challenges. Their work extends beyond individual classrooms or clinics; it is reshaping systems, influencing policy conversations, and modeling dignity-centered care throughout their communities.

The investment in the SEAPC Bennett Scholarship is already yielding a powerful return—measured not just in numbers trained, but in lives transformed. Each graduate represents dozens of children and families who now have access to understanding, skilled, and compassionate support. As the program looks to the future, as a \$100,000 scholarship, the success of these first 28 scholarship recipients serve as both proof of impact and a catalyst for continued expansion.

Through visionary partnership, relational leadership, and a commitment to empowering local professionals, the SEAPC Bennett Scholarship is helping to build a more inclusive and hope-filled future for children with autism and other disabilities across Africa.

# 2025 ACTIVITIES

## Myanmar Earthquake Relief

Over 8,150 people (1,630 families) affected by the Myanmar earthquake received emergency supplies, Bibles, and prayer. In the aftermath of the disaster, friends partnered together to respond quickly with food, water, medicine, and spiritual encouragement—meeting urgent physical needs while standing with impacted communities in faith and prayer during a devastating season.



## Education for the Next Generation

145,800 kids are served daily in Cambodia with education through Banteay Meanchey Arise. Through strengthened public schools and skills training centers, students receive practical education alongside a foundation of faith and character. A dedicated local team continues investing in Cambodia's next generation—equipping students with academic knowledge, vocational skills, and spiritual grounding to help them thrive and shape the future of their communities.



## Care & Protection for Vulnerable Children

789 orphaned, abandoned, and at-risk children received ongoing care and the opportunity to know Jesus through the children's homes we serve. During renewed conflict between Cambodia and Thailand, 73 Cambodian children, along with staff and their families, were safely evacuated to secure locations—ensuring protection, stability, and continued support during a time of uncertainty.

# 2025 ACTIVITIES

## Training First-Generation Leaders

Approximately 10,000 first-generation leaders were trained across India on various Biblical topics. Through regional gatherings, mentorship, and practical teaching, emerging leaders were equipped with strong theological foundations and tools for local ministry. These trainings continue strengthening communities as leaders serve faithfully, disciple others, and guide growing congregations with wisdom and integrity.

## Hope Behind Bars

Over 500 salvations were recorded in Kenyan prisons as thousands of inmates heard the hope of Jesus. More than 5,000 men in men's prisons and over 200 women in a women's prison received ministry, encouragement, and prayer—many responding in faith, lives forever changed.

Friends from Kenya and South Africa served side by side, while 250 Kenyan pastors gathered for encouragement and strengthening. These outreaches continue fueling discipleship, leadership development, and ongoing Gospel impact within prisons and surrounding communities across Kenya.

What began behind prison walls is now reaching far beyond them—carrying renewed hope into churches, cities, and communities across the nation.



# FRIENDS AROUND THE TABLE

In a year of tremendous global shifts and shaking, Friends Around the Table was a rallying point of relationship, stability, hope, and power. From Thessaloniki, Greece, we witnessed health partnerships and reconciliation in a war-torn region finding shalom. In Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, we encountered awakening and prayer across Asia Pacific. In São Paulo, Brazil, unity and breakthrough spread across Latin America. We closed the year in Johannesburg, South Africa, seeing powerful movements of prayer and renewed expectation—uniting a chaotic world in prayer and passion for Jesus.

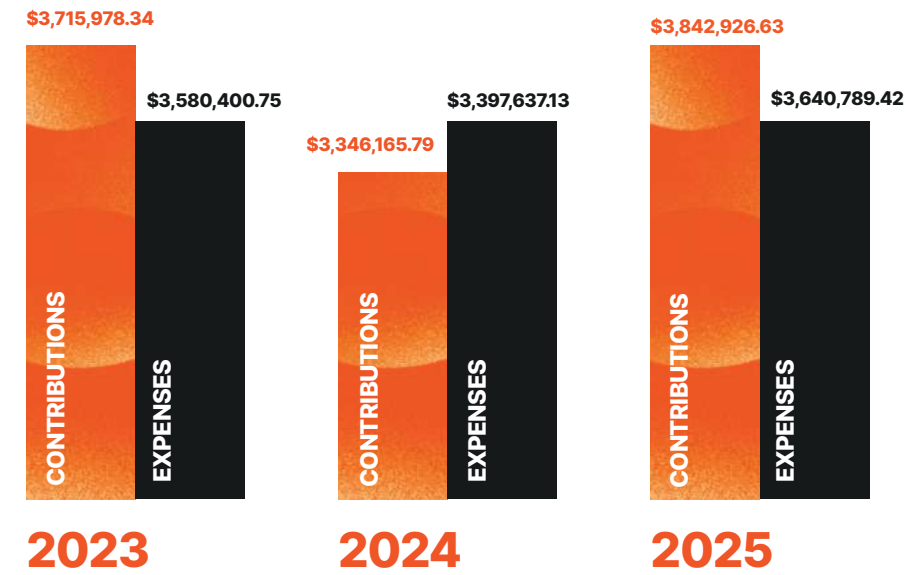

# A LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

Dear Friends and Partners,

As I reflect on this past year, I am filled with deep gratitude and awe for what God has done through the SEAPC. In a season marked by global instability, conflict, and uncertainty, SEAPC has continued to stand as a place of prayer, relationship, and faithful obedience to Jesus—anchored in hope and propelled by love.

Across nations and cultures, we witnessed prayer open doors that strategy alone never could. Through Friends Around the Table, relationships were formed and strengthened, quietly reshaping regions of the world. From Thessaloniki to Ulaanbaatar, São Paulo to Johannesburg, these gatherings became sacred spaces of unity, reconciliation, and vision. In places marked by division, we saw healing. In regions weary from conflict, we experienced renewal. God met us again and again at His Table.

One of the most encouraging expressions of SEAPC's mission this year has been the Bennett Scholarship Initiative in Uganda. Through our partnership with Africa Renewal University, 28 African professionals have now completed specialized training to serve children with autism and other developmental disabilities. These graduates are not only bringing skilled, compassionate care to long-underserved families, but also changing cultural perceptions and building sustainable, locally-led solutions. What began around relational tables in Uganda is now bearing fruit across communities—and the impact is only growing.

Prayer walking continues to expand far beyond its origins. New nations are being plowed in prayer, biblical resources are being translated into new languages, and indigenous leaders are carrying this practice into cities and villages across Central Asia, Europe, Latin America, and beyond.

From Mongolia to Bolivia, from Greece to Brazil, the movement is multiplying—not because of us, but because God is stirring His people to pray.

We also saw the tangible love of Christ expressed in moments of crisis. Families affected by the earthquake in Myanmar received emergency aid, Scripture, and prayer. Children's homes in Cambodia were protected and evacuated during the regional conflict. Medical outreaches in Guatemala brought healing and hope to hundreds. Nearly 800 orphaned and at-risk children around the world received care, education, and the opportunity to know Jesus through this community's faithfulness.

None of this happens in isolation. It is the result of prayerful partnership—friends who give, pray, go, and believe together. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to thank you for your trust, generosity, and shared commitment to seeing God's Kingdom come across the nations.

As we look ahead, we do so with great hope. We are confident that God is uniting His people, nation by nation, at the Table of communion, prayer, and mission. Thank you for standing with SEAPC. It is truly an honor to serve alongside you.

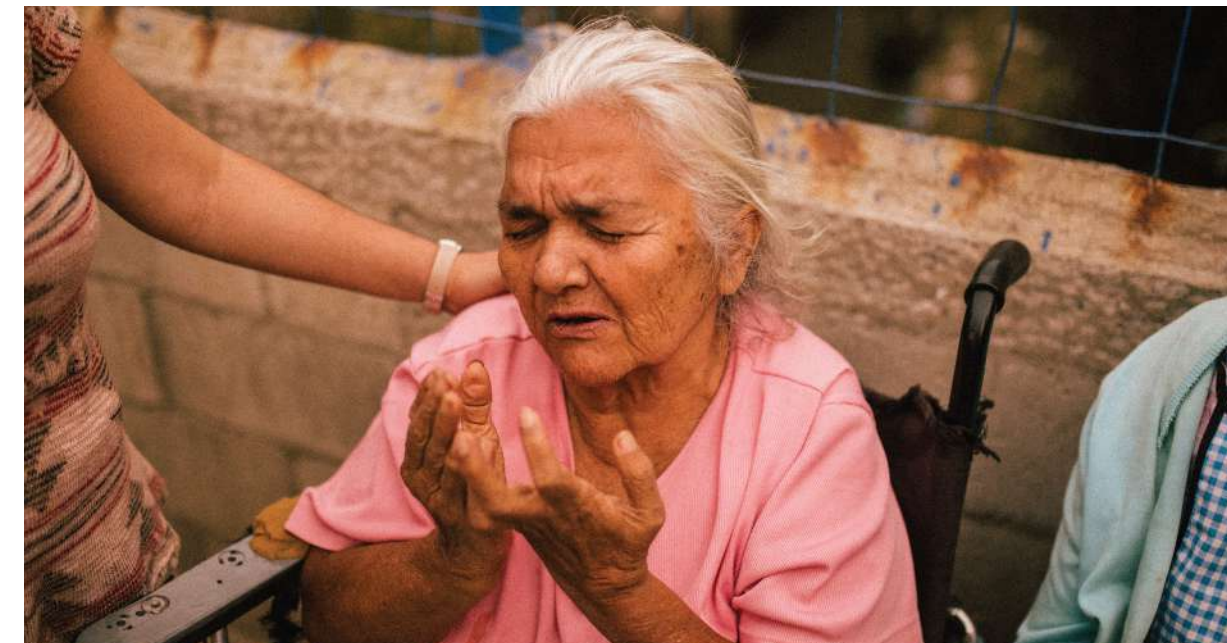
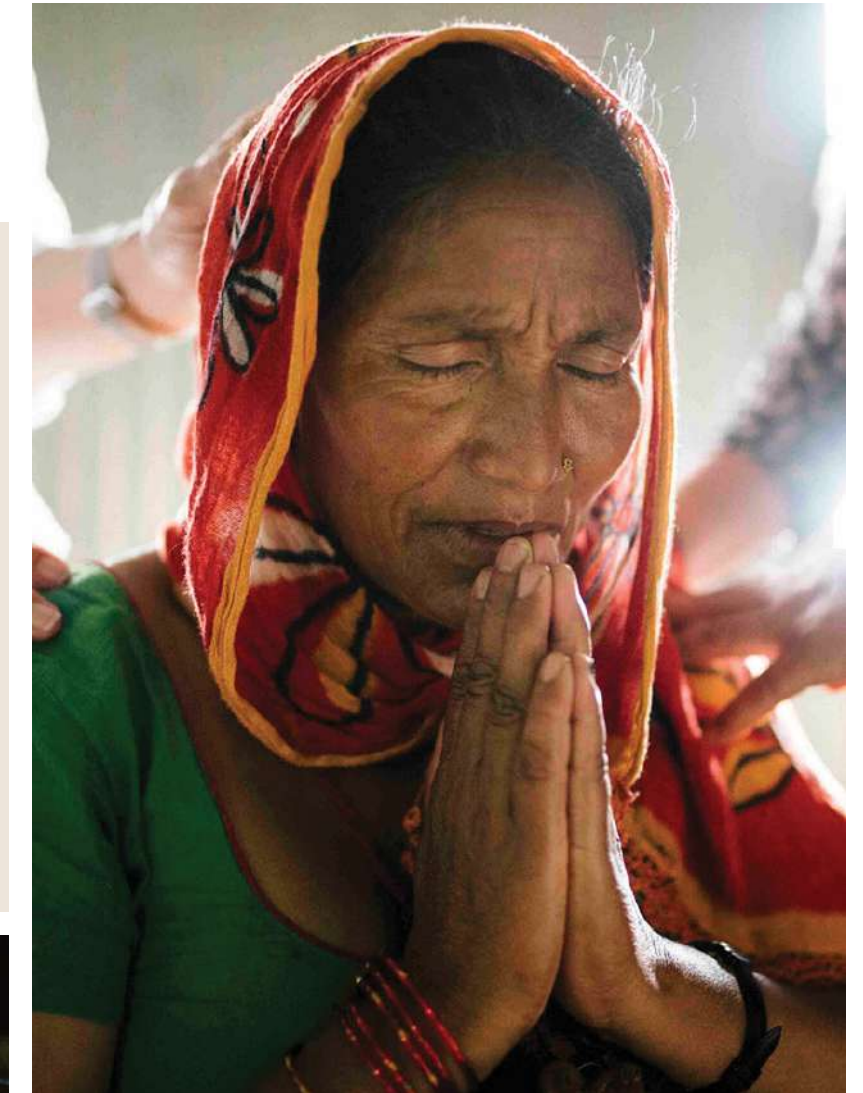
**Deepen Your Faith.
