## DAMAGE PREVENTION

#### **WHAT IS 8999?**

Digging related damage is a major cause of pipeline accidents. It is the national Miss Utility telephone number that initiates the process of marking the underground utility lines in your yard or on your job. When you contact You you will be routed to your local One Call Center - in the District of Columbia, Maryland or Virginia. Local One Call Center personnel then notify member utilities, such as Washington Gas, to mark the approximate locations of underground utility lines with high-visibility safety paint and/or flags. The service is free.

## C.A.R.E.

Call before you dig.
Allow time for marking.
Respect the marks.
Excavate carefully.



### WHY CALL 8119?

When using mechanized equipment, it is required by law to contact Miss Utility at **at before digging**.

Everyone, *including homeowners and construction companies*, should always contact **Miss Utility** at **The state of the s** 

weekends and holidays — before you

are scheduled to begin any digging, regardless of size or depth. This includes, but is not limited to:

- General digging
- Gardening
- Landscaping
- Home improvements and/or major construction
- Excavation
- Demolition



Do not begin digging until the lines have been marked or confirmed as "no conflict." If in doubt, check back with to be sure there are no underground utilities where you plan to dig.

Most importantly, dialing an help avoid serious injury and even fatalities, as well as property damage and significant expense that can occur when underground utilities are damaged. Always contact Miss Utility at before you dig, each dig, every dig.
