COMMUNITY NOTICE: GAS PIPELINE REPLACEMENT

The gas pipeline replacement project plan approved by the District's Public Service Commission (PSC) proactively replaces aging, leak-prone pipes, reduces the risk of gas leaks and improves the overall safety and reliability of our system.

Working Together to Improve Safety and Reliability

To help ensure the continued safety and reliability of our natural gas system, pipeline replacement work may take place in your neighborhood at some point during the project timeline. This important infrastructure investment will replace aging gas pipelines with modern materials designed to enhance system performance, improve public safety, and support reliable service for years to come.

What Residents Can Expect

- Construction crews and utility vehicles working in designated areas.
- Temporary traffic adjustments, parking restrictions, or lane closures.
- Sidewalk or roadway excavations near project locations.
- Restoration of affected pavement, landscaping, and other disturbed areas following construction.

We understand construction can be inconvenient, and we appreciate your cooperation as we complete these critical improvements. These upgrades will help provide a safer, more reliable natural gas system for our community.

Safety Is Our Top Priority

Our crews are trained to follow strict safety procedures and industry standards throughout the project. Work zones will be clearly marked, and every effort will be made to minimize disruption while maintaining a safe environment for residents, motorists, and pedestrians.

How You Can Help

For your safety and the safety of our workers:

- Observe all construction signs and barriers.
- Use caution when traveling near work zones.
- Keep children and pets away from active construction areas.
- Follow any temporary traffic or parking instructions.

If You Suspect a Natural Gas Leak or Other Emergency

Natural gas has a distinctive sulfur-like odor. If you detect a gas smell:

1. Leave the area immediately.
2. Avoid creating sparks or using electrical devices.
3. Call 911, and then Washington Gas Emergency Leak Line at 844-WASHGAS (927-4427), selecting option 1. Emergency responders and Washington Gas will take action 24/7 to make sure you and the community stay safe.
