In just over 5 short but impactful years, Sweet
Dream Makers has provided **more than 10,000 beds**, and that is truly a milestone to be
celebrated. Your shared belief that every child
should have a bed of their own was put into action



through your commitment to our vision. Together, the unbelievable dedication of our vendors, staff, and volunteers empowered us to make sweet dreams come true.

Our world faced a "new normal" this year; for families with children the continued pandemic, rising housing costs, and transitioning students back to in-person classes were a challenge to navigate. With your support, we delivered a record 2,884 beds in 2021! That's over three times the number of beds we provided our very first year in 2017. While the reality of the staggering need for beds grounds us, we are humbled to bring respite to so many local families.

There are endless reasons why families need beds. Many of those circumstances bring tears to our eyes, but "bedlessness" in our local neighborhoods is something we can solve – literally overnight. I invite you to turn to Page 6 to read more about "bedlessness," and the reports from families whose lives have improved from receiving beds of their own.

This past year, we delivered 19% more beds than in 2020, resulting in over 300 beds per month going forward! Not only did we continue to serve Palm Beach County with tenacity, we committed ourselves to a controlled expansion into Broward County. Now hundreds of additional children and their families will have a good night's rest for years to come.

As we enter our 6th year of service, we know there is much work to be done in 2022. Your commitment to getting kids off the floor and into a bed is a tremendous testimony to your care for our community. I hope you are enlightened about our vision and feel inspired to stay involved. ### **OUR MISSION**

Sweet Dream Makers improves the health and well-being of children and families by providing beds, bedding, and essential furniture.

### **OUR VISION**

We won't rest until every child who is sleeping on the floor, sharing beds, or sleeping in unsafe, unsanitary conditions has a bed of their own so they can dream of a better future.

In 2021, Sweet Dream Makers provided **2,884 beds** to children and their families.

Through our flagship program, A Bed of My Own, children and their families in need are referred through our network of 75+ social service providers and receive at no cost:

- A new mattress
- A mattress protector
- A box spring
- Bed frame
- Bedding including sheets and comforter chosen by the children
- Fresh pillows

# WHO WE SERVE

The majority of families we serve are low-wage earners – individuals who, despite working tirelessly to provide for their children, need assistance to make sure they have a safe, clean, and appropriate place to sleep each night. With both the pandemic and economic vulnerability resulting in changing times, these families were faced with extraordinary challenges in 2021.

# **EXPANDING OUR REACH**

A very generous grant from The Jim Moran Foundation allowed us to pursue last year's goal to reach beyond Palm Beach County and mobilize our Broward Expansion program. With this support, we increased our total bed deliveries in Broward County to 16.5% in 2021 - 477 beds this year compared to 73 in 2020.

In addition, we also began serving veterans and senior citizens experiencing bedlessness.

# **Total Beds Provided**



# People Served in 2021



# WHAT IS "BEDLESSNESS"?


Bedlessness is a symptom of modern poverty, right here in our own neighborhoods – co-sleeping, babies without cribs, children sleeping on air mattresses, or bare floors.


Thankfully, families are receiving aid for food, housing, aftercare, and more, but many do not have the financial means to purchase furniture, especially beds. Until now, no organization in South Florida was specifically addressing beddlessness, the staggering need for beds, that we are now solving within 24-48 hours.

In 2021, referring case managers reported many causes of bedlessness:

# PERSPECTIVE OF A CASE MANAGER

Anthony, Wraparound Facilitator at Community Partners

"When I first became acquainted with SDM, I realized how awesome the program was. I never thought about it. People always give away clothes but one of the most important things is a bed and a good night's sleep

Each time I visit a home, I'm there firsthand to see when beds are needed. I can call Sweet Dream Makers and they will deliver new beds and bedding within 24-48 hours. I'll never forget this one home I visited. It's ingrained in my head. This single mother was working 6 days a week, trying so hard. Her 16-year-old son's room was impeccably clean... but he was sleeping on a toddler bed and a couch cushion... taped together by duct tape... duct tape! The siblings needed beds too.

There's an element of shame, you know,

# **IMPROVING BEHAVIOR, GRADES, AND SLEEP QUALITY**

The pandemic combined with the economic shift of the housing market caused continued stresses for the working poor in 2021. Our effort to alleviate the unending need for beds increased 19% from 2020.

Our surveys of the children and teens who received a bed this year show that nearly 80% of them had improvement in their physical health, and that these vulnerable students were also able to maintain adequate sleep, resulting in better focus at school. Studies show that a good night's rest has a direct positive correlation with learning.

These efforts to bring relief to school-aged children who have experienced an educational roller coaster since March 2020 were bolstered by our 4th Annual Back To School Campaign. For the second year in a row, the effort was doubled by the generous support of Hands On Tzedakah ("HOT"), who matched all gifts from first-time donors to Sweet Dream Makers. This collaboration yielded an impressive 170 beds for local students to start the school year off with a good night's sleep.

parents don't want to admit that they need help providing basic necessities. But that's why we're here.

Once we set up the bed that kid realized it was actually real, that this was for him. He got his own space, big enough for him - not little cushions taped together. Everyone got new beds, bedding and pillows.

Our post-delivery surveys to families reported that

Nearly 80% of children who receive a bed of their own report improved behavior, grades, and quality of sleep.

Our team felt so good about it. How can you get a good night's sleep on a makeshift bed like that? I know how these families feel and I've been in their shoes. A nice firm mattress – it pays dividends. I'm so happy to partner with Suzy and the good work Sweet Dream Makers is doing.

People really appreciate your help – they really do."





# MAKING A HOUSE A HOME: OUR WAREHOUSE PROGRAM

Families who are unable to afford beds are often unable to afford other essential furniture, such as dressers to store clothes or tables for eating, studying, or gathering. For this reason, Sweet Dream Makers operates a small warehouse of gently-used furniture and housewares, generously funded by the Pat Moran Family Foundation. All items are donated by community members and distributed free of charge as needed through our Warehouse Program.

Warehouse Manager, James Bulger, and his team pick up furniture every Saturday from our generous neighbors throughout Boca Raton and Delray. James works closely with Jodi Ijac, who serves as our Warehouse Program Coordinator making appointments directly with families who need other essential furniture items. **Together, our community donated approximately 3,000 furniture and houseware items** — totalling more than \$65,500 in inkind donations — to 200+ families in 2021.

There are many reasons why families find themselves without beds and furniture. Oftentimes, families who overcome homelessness or escape domestic abuse are finally placed in more permanent housing – but the space is empty. Or perhaps bed bugs infest the living space and they have no choice but to throw away their furniture and beds, causing an already struggling caregiver to start from scratch. Our Warehouse Program allows recipients to pick out the furniture they need – at no cost. The dignity of choosing their own items creates a feeling of ownership and pride. *It's making a house feel like a home for the first time in a long time* – where their children can thrive in a safe, comfortable, and stable environment.

Some of the most requested items are:

- ★ Dressers
- Dining Tables
- Sofas
- Lamps
- Housewares
- **★** Towels
- **Blankets**
- ★ Toasters

Dressers are so often requested by the families we serve that we allocated a small portion of our budget in 2021 to deliver them with beds when necessary.



### **EVENTS**

As life started to return to "a new normal," our organization continued to face challenges planning our annual events in an ever-evolving climate. Pivoting to keep our attendees safe, our shift to 3 outdoor, open-air events provided safety and peace of mind as we transitioned back to in-person events.

One of those initiatives was our **Inaugural Play Fore Beds Premiere Golf Event** held at Royal Palm
Yacht and Country Club. With PNC Private Bank as
presenting sponsor, our newest invite-only event
included over 80 golfers who enjoyed 18 holes,
whiskey tasting, and an elaborate, chef-inspired
dinner.

In addition, our **2nd Annual Bingo & Breakfast for Guys & Dolls** had a deeper sense of community this year as the outdoor event at Boca West Country
Club was renamed in memory of Janice August – an enthusiastic SDM Ambassador and generous supporter.

Our most successful year yet came to a close with our **4th Annual "Be A Sweet Dream Maker" Celebration** surrounded by 250 of our committed donors and friends who raised their glasses and bid paddles to celebrate all that Sweet Dream Makers has accomplished in the past year. The Addison was transformed into a winter wonderland for this exclusive invite-only evening, including an elaborate live auction and outpouring of generosity. The Celebration raised funds to provide over 1,200 beds for the start of 2022. The impact of the fundraiser would not have been possible without the generous support of our event hosts Doris and Neil Gillman, our 2021 Sweet Dream Makers of the Year.

Doris Gillman added, "When we tuck our own grandchildren in at night and wish them sweet dreams, we feel so blessed that we're able to provide children who are less fortunate the safety and security of having a bed of their own, too. That's what every child deserves."




