At Summer's End



NMCGRF Funds Outdoor Game for Sports Park



Our residents love a good game of Corn Bag Toss! About twice a year, VHRC holds a Corn Bag Toss tournament, either indoors or outdoors, and it always brings out a crowd. This summer, residents asked Mirna Fuentes, VHRC's Special Events Coordinator, if the cornhole boards, which are usually stored away, could be left outdoors in the Sport Park so that people could play the popular game whenever they wanted to. However, because the boards are not weatherproof and would warp and crack if exposed to the elements, this was not possible.

Mirna reached out to the Foundation, and we were happy to help! NMCGRF stepped in with a grant from the Innovation & Enhancement Fund to purchase two outdoor, weatherproof cornhole board sets that are made of Trex as well as eight all-weather bags. This equipment will remain outdoors at the Sport Park for all to use. Corn Bag Toss, anyone?



Canines and Cocktails Event Hosted by Foundation

VHRC welcomed some very special guests this month – the four-legged kind. Vincent, Bentley and SealGaire were greeted with pats, hugs, smiles and cuddles on August 9, when they stopped by our Penthouse Lounge. Our canine visitors – a golden retriever, black lab and yellow lab – came from Veterans Moving Forward (VMF), a nonprofit organization based in Dulles that provides service and therapy dogs to veterans with physical or mental health challenges. They had brought along some humans, but the dogs were clearly the stars of our Canines and Cocktails event, organized by Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation.



It takes about a year and a half for VMF to train a dog for service. The dog is then matched with a particular veteran at no cost to the veteran. "Veterans Moving Forward trains a dog to work with the needs of a specific individual, which is great," said resident Donna Hall, who had raised Jug, one of VMF's first service dogs, in 2011. "They really care for their teams of veterans and dogs."

With our similar missions in support of veterans, VMF and NMCGRF have been



community partners since 2017. "Working with a partner like Vinson Hall means the world to us," said Kerri Kline, President and CEO of VMF. "We truly appreciate your support of what we do. And we loved seeing how the dogs impacted your resident veterans!"

At the graduation ceremony, which was held in our Ballroom, the teachers first presented a slide show full of happy memories of the six intergenerational playdates that their kids and our residents have had on campus. Then the preschoolers each came up on stage to receive their diploma, the entire class performed a song for residents, and everyone enjoyed popcorn, lemonade and a movie.

Kidstretch Preschool is run by Homestretch, a nonprofit organization that helps homeless families rebuild their lives and become self-sufficient. NMCGRF is proud to have built this new partnership with our neighbors in Falls Church, and we look forward to starting up another great year of intergenerational playdates this fall!
