NMCGRF Brings Residents and Kids Together on Veterans Day



Many VHRC residents have served our country through the military during their lives. So when Chesterbrook Elementary School asked if we could provide speakers to help them commemorate Veterans Day, our residents were happy to answer the call. On Friday, November 8, the

Foundation was honored to arrange talks by nine VHRC veterans, who generously donated their time at Chesterbook, our community partner and the school next door. Over the course of the morning, VHRC veterans visited two classrooms each to talk about their military service, answer questions from 2nd graders through 6th graders, and bring history to life.

Mike Cluff set the stage by explaining the military's role to the students. "We are here to protect the United States of America, and we take that job seriously." Gene Sizemore talked about the advantages of a military career: "You get to see all parts of the world and you get to work with topnotch people." Marie Brugmans discussed how the military has changed for women since she served in 1960. "At that time, you couldn't have children if you were in the



military. Women can go places today, as can men."



The students peppered our residents with questions. John McNerney was asked if he ever shot anyone with a gun. "Only when the bad guys were shooting at me first. In battle, when they're no longer shooting at you, you don't keep shooting, you capture them." One student asked Roger

Gilbertson if ships ever sank. Roger removed the USS Oklahoma cap that he had been wearing, and then recounted what had happened to the ship that was attacked at Pearl Harbor and now rests "somewhere in the Pacific." Dale Vesser finished up his last visit with inspiring words for his young listeners on Veterans Day: "Give thanks that others have served, and hope that if you're called you can measure up."

Tairique moved to our community as part of the Navy Marine Coast Guard Residence Foundation's Warrior Transition program, which provides a home to soldiers who are transitioning out of the military as they recover from injuries or illness that occurred while they served. In his remarks, Tairique thanked everyone for making him feel so welcome and said he would miss the

friends he made at VHRC. We are happy to report that Tairique will remain in the local area as he works on his degree in Computer Science. We will miss having him in our community and wish him all the best!
